



Improvement in FAFSA Completion Numbers

- Increased buy-in from districts, schools, and families
 - 96% of high school seniors in Connecticut public schools were included in the FAFSA Completion report
 - More than 60% of Connecticut's high school seniors completed FAFSA before May 1




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Key Findings of FAFSA Completion



FAFSA Completion Associates Strongly with Postsecondary Enrollment


Immediate college enrollment following high school graduation, by percentile of district poverty and FAFSA completion status.

In Connecticut, FAFSA completion rates in the highest income districts are 13 percentage points higher than those in the lowest income districts.

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Key Changes to the 2020-2021 FAFSA Form




The 2021–22 FAFSA changes


- The income threshold for an automatic zero Expected Family Contribution (EFC) increased from \$26,000 to \$27,000 for the 2021–22 award year.
- When students and parents use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT), the IRS DRT will now transfer information about whether they filed a Schedule 1. The answer will be based on all current exceptions for filing a Schedule 1. The transferred data for the Schedule 1 fields will be masked.
- For students and parents who don't use the IRS DRT, the Schedule 1 help topics will be updated to include all current exceptions for filing a Schedule 1. "Capital Gains" has been removed as an exception and "Virtual Currency" has been added as an exception.
- Many FAFSA help topics referencing financial forms now feature images of those forms with relevant line numbers highlighted.

How to Motivate Parents

- Start the process before 12th grade
 - Middle School "Financial Planning Seminars"
- Communicate consistently and with a variety of touchpoints
 - o Email, text, social media
- Understand your community
 - Translate printed information into the language(s) spoken by local parents. Schedule events during the evening and on the weekends. Provide transportation or vouchers. Offer child care and food.

Rename your events:

- "Financial Aid Workshop" to "CA\$H Labs"
- "Scholarship Night" to "Pizza for Dollar\$"
- Workshops that focus on "Credit and Debt Management for Parents" - early on

EdSight Postsecondary Deep Dive
