CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM – DAY CARE CENTERS

(HARTFORD, CT) - Many local child care centers and adult day care centers in Connecticut participate in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) and provide nutritious meals to more than 14,000 participants daily, at more than 385 locations statewide through 136 locally sponsored programs.

The Child and Adult Care Food Program is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and provides nutritious meals and snacks at no separate charge to infants, young children and adults receiving services in day care centers, as well as infants and children living in emergency shelters. The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) accepts applications from public and private institutions to become sponsors of the CACFP on an ongoing basis. Sponsoring institutions serve meals to all participants regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.

Child and Adult Care Food Program sponsors are reimbursed for each meal served, according to predetermined U.S. Department of Agriculture reimbursement rates based on the income levels of the families served by the program. The following income guidelines will be used to determine funding in Connecticut from July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016.
