#### I. Introduction

The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE), as part of its ongoing efforts to support and expand school health services provided to Connecticut students, has surveyed District Nursing Coordinators since 2004. As one component of these continuing efforts, the CSDE commissioned the Center for Program Research & Evaluation (CPRE) at EdAdvance to develop and update an online survey to collect information regarding the status of school health services from school districts throughout Connecticut. The survey's objective has been to assist the CSDE in understanding school health services' quality and needs in individual school districts. The data gathered in this survey has been instrumental in shedding light on the ever-changing nature of school health services.

Before the 2014-2015 school year, and in concert with *Public Act No. 14-66*, the CSDE and CPRE worked together to add questions to the School Health Services Survey to collect information on the nature, extent, and circumstances of students' concussions. The survey gathered concussion data for the first time after the 2014-2015 school year. During the Summer of 2015, the CSDE and CPRE continued to improve the Survey and data collection methodology. What follows is an analysis of the concussion data collected for the 2019-2020 School Year.

## **II. Executive Summary**

During the winter of 2019-2020, the State Department of Education sent an email to each of the state's school districts with instructions on how to complete the Health Services Program Information Survey. The districts were asked to work with their District Nursing Coordinators to gather and report the data required in the survey. The 2019-2020 email correspondence (Attached-Appendix A) announced that the entire survey would be **mandatory.** 

Of the 197 School Districts in Connecticut, *136 School Districts* (Appendix C) (69.0%) completed the survey. This number is slightly less than in 2018-2019<sup>1</sup>. The decrease can be explained by the events surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, which impacted schools in the spring of 2020. For the schools that completed the survey in 2019-2020, there were *3,975* diagnosed concussions. As in the previous year, the most significant number of

concussions occurred during "Interscholastic Athletic Activities" followed by "Outside of School" and "Non-School Sports Related" activities. As a result of the diagnosed concussions reported, school districts reported 7,408 accommodations. The majority of students with reported diagnosed concussions (71.1%) missed less than five school days because of the concussion, while a small percentage (less than 1%) missed more than 20 school days.

### **III. Results of Concussion Questions**

The concussion section of the Health Services Program Information Survey consisted of seven questions. The survey was designed to prevent respondents from moving on to other parts of the survey or submitting the survey unless these questions had been answered. What follows are the descriptive statistics and synopsis of those questions as well as a comparison to the previous year's data, where appropriate. *The TOTAL number of students diagnosed with a concussion during the 2019-2020 school year* was <u>3,975</u>. The mean number of concussions per district was 29.2.

#### A. Concussions by Gender






The highest number of reported diagnosed concussions occurred during Interscholastic Athletic Activities (33.7%), and Outside of School/Other reasons (23.0%).




Football accounted for the most concussion occurrences among specific school-sponsored sports, resulting in 470 diagnosed concussions among reporting districts in 2019-2020. Girls' soccer was next with 236 concussions reported, followed by boys' soccer with 203 occurrences.


"Physical Activity Accommodations" and "Academic Accommodations" represent the largest number of interventions required. There were 44 directives for "Homebound Instruction" due to a diagnosed concussion.




The average length of the "Physical Activity Accommodation" was 20.3 days while the average "Academic Accommodation" was 18.7 days. The average "Homebound Instruction" accommodation lasted 3.3 days.

The majority (71.1%) of students diagnosed with a concussion missed less than 5 school days. 14.0% of students missed between 5 and 10 days of school while less than 1.0% of students missed more than 20 days of school.

#### V. Data Limitations

With substantial effort from District Nursing Supervisors and the CSDE, 69.0% of school districts completed the School Health Services Survey. The challenges posed by the COVID-19 epidemic meant that most schools in the state were closed for many months. The data presented this year should not be compared to previous years' data for that reason.

Additionally, the data reported by some districts were inconsistent with expected results. For example, the total number of diagnosed concussions is the first required question in the survey. The instructions for the following questions remind respondents that the numbers entered must add up to the number of diagnosed concussions documented in the first question. In many cases, this was not the case. This disconnect makes the analysis of the questions complex.

#### VI. Conclusions and Recommendations

The School Health Services Survey contained questions on student concussions in 2014-2015 for the first time. The concussion questions were constructed with cooperation between the CSDE and the CPRE at EdAdvance. The questions have been updated and improved in the subsequent years. CPRE and CSDE will complete another round of question improvement before administering the 2020-2021 survey. The updated survey will address reporting errors in the concussion question set while also streamlining the district coordinators' completion process.

As with all surveys, the usefulness of the results is dependent upon the response rate. In 2019-2020, the response rate was down significantly from previous years. Much of this decrease can be explained by the COVID-19 pandemic. Ongoing efforts should be made in subsequent years to ensure a more robust data collection. Districts also need additional training in how to track and report concussion data accurately. If these efforts continue, comparisons between school years for concussion data will become more appropriate.
