The State Advisory Council for Special Education (SAC) is reaching out to let you know of a possible leadership opportunity for one of your high school or transition age students who is currently eligible for special education. We are actively seeking student/transition age representatives.

The SAC is a committee that is a representative group of students, parents, education professionals, and stakeholders collaborating on issues related to special education in Connecticut.

Below are some examples of the work that the Council focuses on:

- Provide policy guidance with respect to special education and related services for children and youth with disabilities in the state.
- Advise the CT Department of Education of unmet needs of educating students with disabilities.
- Advise the CT Department of Education on the development and implementation of policies relating to the coordination of services for children with disabilities.

The SAC typically meets five to nine times per year and student representatives attend as their school and other extracurricular activities permit. It is perfectly acceptable to attend a portion of a council meeting, or even miss a meeting due to other commitments. Members may attend meetings in person or via phone/Zoom.
