FINAL DECISION AND ORDER

ISSUES:

1. Did the Board offer an appropriate program for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 school years including the 2019 extended school year?
2. If not, is residential placement at the Glenholme School the appropriate program for the Student for the 2019-20 school year and should the Board be ordered to place the Student residentially at the Glenholme School for the 2019-20 school year?
3. Is the Student entitled to compensatory education?

PROCEDURAL HISTORY/SUMMARY:

The Parents filed their Due Process Complaint and Request for Hearing on December 9, 2019. The Hearing Officer was appointed on December 10, 2019. A Prehearing Conference was noticed for and held on December 19, 2019. On January 22, 2020, via letter, the Attorney for the parents withdrew their request for a Due Process Hearing based on the settlement of this matter and requested that it be dismissed with prejudice.

FINAL DECISION AND ORDER:

In light of the above, the matter is **DISMISSED**.
