FINAL DECISION AND ORDER

ISSUES:

1. Did the Board offer an appropriate program for the 2017-2018 school year, including ESY 2018 from May 19, 2018 through the end of ESY 2018?

- 2. Did the Board offer an appropriate program for the 2018-19 school year, including ESY 2019?
- 3. Did the Board offer an appropriate program for the 2019-20 school year, including ESY 2020?
- 4. If not, is residential placement at Landmark the appropriate program for the Student for the 2019-20 school year and should the Board be ordered to place the Student residentially at Landmark for the 2019-20 school year?
- 5. Is the Student entitled to compensatory education?
- 6. Should the Board reimburse the Parents for the Blueprint Shoreline Reading evaluation and neuropsychological evaluation conducted by Dr. Goodell?

PROCEDURAL HISTORY/SUMMARY:

The Parents filed their Due Process Complaint and Request for Hearing on May 19, 2020. The Hearing Officer was appointed on May 26, 2020. A Prehearing Conference was noticed for and held on June 1, 2020. On July 9, 2020, via letter, the Attorney for the parents withdrew their request for a Due Process Hearing based on the settlement of this matter and requested that it be dismissed with prejudice.

INAL DECISION AND ORDER:

In light of the above, the matter is **DISMISSED**.
