


Manually Entering Designated Supports for Students who are not Section 504 or Special Education



Manually Entering Designated Supports for Students who are not Section 504 or Special Education



- Designated Supports for students who are not identified as Special Education or Section 504 can be entered directly into TIDE by the District Administrator (DA) or School Test Coordinator (SC) either manually or via the batch upload process.
 - These supports must be entered prior to testing.
 - They will be visible in the TIDE and will be immediately available to the student.






Manually Entering Designated Supports Continued



IMPORTANT: Do not include students with IEPs or Section 504 plans in any batch uploads.

- Designated supports and accommodations sync directly to TIDE from CT-SEDS.
- If you find a discrepancy with a student's accommodations or designated supports, please contact the student's Case Manager.
- All edits must be made through the amendment or reconvening process in CT-SEDS.





Checking Accessibility Features



- PPTs should review and confirm that designated supports and accommodations are not conflicting when selecting them for statewide testing. For example, selecting:
 - ☐ Embedded Text-to-Speech and Non-Embedded Read Aloud
 - ☐ Embedded Speech-to-Text and Scribe
 - ☐ Embedded Color Contrast and Non-Embedded Color Contrast or Color Overlay
 - ☐ Braille Booklet and Large Print
 - ☐ Specialized Calculator (Grades 6-8 Math or Science Grades 5, 8, and 11), which is a Braille/Talking Calculator, and Calculator (Math Grades 6-8 Special Documented Accommodation)



Non-Embedded Tools



Reminder: Any non-embedded universal tools, designated supports or accommodations should be prepared in advance for student ahead of test day.

- Refer to the student's TIDE dashboard or CT-SEDS accommodation report for a list of non-embedded supports.
- Most non-embedded test tools can be downloaded and printed from the CAI portal: <u>Home Page</u>.





