



2023 Connecticut SAT School Day

All accommodations must first be entered in the [College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities \(SSD\) online system](#) between **November 14, 2022, and January 31, 2023**, and approved by the College Board. Then, accommodations and supports listed on the Non-Standard Administration Report (NAR) should be set in the College Board's TIDE system prior to testing. The TIDE system will open on February 7, 2023.

Universal Tools

(Available to ALL students)

Embedded (Provided by the Test Delivery System)

- Calculator: Available onscreen for calculator-allowed questions.
- Clock: Counts down the time left for each section and gives a 5-minute warning.
- Highlighter: Available for marking text, questions, and answer options.
- Line focus: Combines line reader with masking to guide students as they read.
- Mark for review: Allows students to flag questions for later review.
- Notes: For digital note-taking; students also receive scratch paper.
- Reference: Allows students to view standard mathematical formulas.
- Strikethrough: Allows students to eliminate answer options.
- Zoom in/Zoom out: Enlarges the text and images on a test page.

Non-Embedded (Provided by the Proctor)

- Hand-held calculator (for calculator-allowed segment; refer to the [College Board SAT Calculator Policy](#))

Accommodations

(Available to students with an IEP or 504 Plan)

Embedded (Provided by the Test Delivery System)

- Assistive technology: Includes screen readers and refreshable braille (RBDs).
- Color contrast: Displays the test with different background or font color.
- Font size: Adjust text content font size, up to 8 times the original size.
- Four-function calculator: Allows students to use the Desmos 4-function calculator on the Math Test – No Calculator portion.
- Mouse pointer: Adjusts the mouse/cursor to match color and size preference.
- Permissive mode: Allows students to use any preapproved hardware or software with the secure browser.
- Streamline mode: Linear presentation; eliminates split screen.
- Test time and breaks: Various timing scenarios based on documented need.
- Text-to-speech: Allows all sections of the test to be read aloud.

Non-Embedded (Provided by the Proctor)

- Modified settings
- Small group testing
- Food/drink/medication
- Printed copy of verbal instructions
- Sign language interpreter for oral instructions only
- Paper test book (must be ordered through the College Board)
- Large-print test book (14 point, 20, point, other) (must be ordered through the College Board)
- Braille/Raised line drawings
- Human reader (requires paper test booklet)
- Scribe to record responses
- Hand-held calculator on the Math Test- No Calculator portion; refer to the [College Board SAT Calculator Policy](#)

Supports for EL/MLs

(Available to students formally identified as an English learner/multilingual learner)

Embedded (Provided by the Test Delivery System)

This support requires approval by the College Board in SSD and must be set in the College Board's TIDE system prior to testing.

- 50% time and one-half (must be entered in SSD online by January 31, 2023).

Non-Embedded (Provided by the Proctor)

This support does not require approval by the College Board in SSD.
