

New for SAT in SY25-26

Updating Coordinator Level Staff, Enhancements to Test Day Toolkit and Bluebook, More Accommodations

- Updating Coordinator Level Staff no more surveys self-serve through SSOR with 24/7 access & insight!
- Test Day Toolkit
 - Filter for Accommodations
 - More data fields on student rosters
 - Proctor preview mode!
- Bluebook:
 - Embedded scientific calculator (not just graphing calculator)
 - More obvious expand/collapse and stronger notification of how to end extended time early
 - Option eliminator now default "on" and choices made are retained until test concludes
 - Highlighting will have more and more distinct colors; available for prompt and answer choices
- Accommodations
 - Access request form for SSD Online is now online
 - New ability to "exchange" select accommodations for near instant approval in SSD Online
 - Screen Reader no longer auto-coupled with extended time
 - Updated Text-to-Speech options






For millions of students, the SAT helps them connect with and stand out to colleges

- The SAT is key to helping identify students from unknown backgrounds and helping them succeed
- The SAT is more fair than other measures in many ways, and differentiates beyond (and with) GPA
- Scores should always be in context, and the SAT should not be the only, or even the most, important factor in admissions

Whether scores are required or optional, the SAT remains an important part of the admissions process.

SAT Total Group Participation (test takers in millions)

Tracking to exceed Class of 2024



- Most, and a growing percentage of, students take the SAT on a school day
- More students take the fall PSAT/NMSQT
- Performance improves with practice, and practice provides insight for instruction



Key Findings

- Providing <u>clear and detailed information</u> about testing policies builds trust and reduces confusion.
- SAT scores can be invaluable for a range of purposes
 including course placement, understanding the incoming class,
 developing retention models and allocating support resources.
- Understanding students' SAT scores alongside college outcome data can help <u>inform testing policies that align with</u> <u>institutional priorities</u>






Accessing the K12 Data Portal

General Information

- You must have a College Board professional educator account associated with your professional email that matches what your institution submitted for your participation in administering SAT Suite assessments.
- Your principal should have on their College Board
 Professional Account dashboard the link "Managing
 Access to Support K-12 Assessment Reporting".
 Clicking that link and following the prompts provided
 they can invite you to the level(s) of access they
 desire (by this process they may have delegated
 this ability to someone else at your school or district).
- As soon as invited, you will receive an automated email to accept: follow the prompts to multi-factor authenticate into the K12 Data Portal.




 After multi-factor authenticating in, access to the K12 Data Portal will automatically appear in your College Board Professional Account under your listed "Tools and Services" pictured here.

Leveraging the K-12 Data Portal

Track student growth from test to test:

- By individuals or groups
- See mean scores for every test taken within the SAT Suite (i.e., PSAT 8/9, PSAT10, PSAT/NMSQT, and prior SATs) and project mean scores for future tests
- Benchmarks to put scores in perspective, as well as spot areas for targeted instruction and review
- Newly designed dashboard provides streamlined navigation by placing everything on the dashboard clearly organized into 5 sections with quick jump links to detailed content and improved student search functions





Growth Report (Detailed View)










Knowledge & Skills Report in the K-12 Data Portal


- See aggregate student performance across eight content domains in the Reading/Writing and Math sections.

Knowledge & Skills Report (Detailed View: Reading/Writing)






Knowledge & Skills (Detailed View: Math)

The Basics:

The SAT has 2 modules in each "Multi-Stage Adaptive" section

Reading & Writing Section

Module 1

Students are given a broad mix of easy, medium, and hard questions.

Module 2

Students are given a targeted mix of questions of varying difficulties based on their performance in module 1 Student's Reading/Writing Score

Math Section

Module 1

Students are given a broad mix of easy, medium, and hard questions.

Module 2

Students are given a targeted mix of questions of varying difficulties based on their performance in module 1

Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing vs Item Level Adaptive Testing

	Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing (MST)	Item Adaptive	
Test Delivery	Sets of questions (called modules)	One item at a time	
Adaptive	Based on how students perform in the previous module	Based on a student responds to each question	
Navigation	Students can review items within a module	Students are not able to go back to a question	
Test Length	Supports shorter test lengths	Supports shorter test lengths	
Examples	GRE, digital SAT	ACCUPLACER, SBAC, NWEA - MAP, NCLEX	





Benefits of Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing

1 Shorter Tests

4 More secure testing

Questions are tailored according to students' achievement

Allows disruptions in internet connectivity

Allows students to navigate back to questions within a module

6 More precise measurement
