This document provides an overview of the NGSS Interim Assessments and how to access resources that support their use with students in the classroom.

NGSS Assessments for Connecticut

The CT State Department of Education supports the use of a variety of assessment resources for use by local school districts. The goal is to provide useful information for various purposes and audiences in support of student learning.

Formative Assessment Resources*: Used every day by teachers to monitor student learning in the classroom and help make ongoing instructional adjustments to better meet student needs. VOLUNTARY

Interim Assessment Resources*: Assessments administered at the end of units or grades to evaluate the learning of groups of students to inform curriculum and instruction at the local level. VOLUNTARY

State Summative Assessments: Assessments given at the end of learning (Grades 5, 8 and 11) to track student performance and inform decisions about curriculum, instruction, professional development, and policy for a variety of stakeholders. **MANDATED BY FEDERAL AND STATE LAW**

Greater frequency of use More useful to students and teach

* Formative and interim assessment <u>resources</u> come from a variety of sources and are shared by states around the country.

What are the NGSS Interim Assessments?

Set of assessment items available for use throughout the year by all CT public schools. Items are very similar to those on the summative tests.

Can be used as practice, to evaluate student learning or as an instructional tool.

Each item is aligned to a single NGSS Performance Expectation.

Available at three grade bands: 3-5, 6-8, 9-12.

Maintained by Cambium Assessment Inc. for use in client states across the country.



What types of NGSS Interim Assessment items are available?

NGSS Interim Assessment items come in two types:

- Shorter, stand-alone items with 1 or 2 interactions
- Longer Item clusters with several interactions

All items include a real-world scenario and ask students to use the science and engineering practices to apply their understanding of disciplinary core ideas and crosscutting concepts to make sense of phenomena or solve a problem.

Items include a variety of interaction constructs including:

- Multiple-choice
- Edit-task choice
- Multi-select
- Table match

- Graphing
- Equation editor
- Experiment simulation
- Design simulation



III. INSTRUCTIONS FOR A STUDENT TO LOG IN AND TAKE AN NGSS INTERIM ASSESSMENT USING THE SECURE BROWSER

Students can take the NGSS Interim Assessments using the Secure Browser or internet browsers such as Chrome and Firefox. The Secure Browser is the same browser used for the Smarter Balanced Summative and Interim Assessments, the NGSS Summative Assessments, and the Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA).




What supports and accommodations are available for the interims?



What results are available from the NGSS Interim Assessments?

Student results from the NGSS Interim Assessments are available through the Centralized Reporting System (CRS). Results are available at the individual student, classroom, school or district levels.



V. HOW TO ACCESS NGSS INTERIM ASSESSMENT RESULTS IN THE CENTRALIZED REPORTING SYSTEM


Following the completion of an NGSS Interim Assessment, teachers may see their students' results in the Centralized Reporting System. You must have a TIDE account to access any secure online system. If you do not have a TIDE account, please contact your School Test Coordinator or District Test Coordinator.

How do I access the NGSS Interim Assessment answer keys?

The answer keys can be accessed by logging into TIDE on the assessment web portal: https://ct.portal.cambiumast.com. On the home page, click on General Resources, then Interim Assessment Materials as shown below. There is an answer key for each grade band.





Access to the interim answer keys requires an account in the assessment web portal set up by the District Test Administrator.

How were the NGSS Interim Assessments developed?

The items are developed and owned by Cambium Assessment Inc. All items have been reviewed by committees of science educators in the participating states and are field tested with students at Grades 5, 8, and 11.


The interim items are part of a larger assessment item bank used for the state summative tests administered in the spring each year. The same <u>item</u> specifications are used for the summative and interim items.

Note: All interim assessment items are considered to be semi-secure. This means that the items are available to CT public school educators to view and administer to students, but they are not available to the public. Educators should not share any interim items outside the school setting.
