Register for E-mail Updates Secure access is available for districts to their own preliminary Smarter Balanced and Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA) results from 2017-18. These results can now be retrieved through the Online Reporting System (ORS) by authorized users. Though most tests have been scored, a few may still be outstanding if tests were administered close to the end of the window on June 8, 2018. Those results will be added to the system in the coming weeks.

As a reminder, since this was a field test year, there are no performance results for the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) Standard Assessment or the Connecticut Alternate Science Assessment (CTAS).

Aggregate results for all districts, schools, and student groups, are expected to be available through EdSight in late August.

Additional Connecticut Writing Portfolio Guides for the Assessment of Writing in Grades K-2

A comprehensive **Writing Portfolio Guide** for narrative, opinion, and informational writing for each of the three grades of kindergarten, one, and two can now be accessed using the table below. Each guide includes the following:

- <u>Sample Reading Text and Writing Prompt</u>: This can be replicated or used as a model when assessing student writing and growth over time.
- <u>Scoring Rubrics</u>: These rubrics measure three scoring dimensions and can be used in their entirety or in part to focus on a specific writing dimension.
- <u>Transcribed/Annotated Anchor Papers</u>: These annotations help identify a range of student writing, representing different strengths or weaknesses in a response, as they are aligned to the grade-level expectations of the standards. Examples of student responses illustrate each score point described in the rubrics.
- Student Writer Checklists: In an effort to promote active learning and student engagement, Student Writer Checklists were developed to guide the writing process. While one checklist is available in kindergarten, three checklists specific to narrative, informational, and opinion writing are available in Grades 1 and 2. These checklists can be modified by teachers to meet the specific areas of focus for student writers.

NEW 2018 PSAT for Alliance and CTECS Districts and 2019 AP Exam Fees for All Low Income Students

The CSDE will cover the cost for the October 2018 administration of the PSAT for Grade 11 students who attend Alliance Districts and Connecticut Technical Education and Career System (CTECS). Additionally, the CSDE and College Board will cover the entire cost of the 2019 AP exam fees for all low-income students who attend public school in Connecticut.

The CSDE has a process with the College Board to redirect bill the CSDE for Grade 11 students who take the October 2018 PSAT from Alliance and CTECS districts. Schools don't need to do anything other than test the students and the billing will take care of itself. However, please make sure that Grade 11 students properly grid their year of graduation (YOG) on the PSAT answer sheet. Mis-grids and blank YOG will result in your school getting billed for those students. Please order the exams as you would normally do. If you have any questions, contact Michelle Rosado.





