# **NEW TIDE Test Setting and the Test Supports/Accommodation Form Webinar**

A webinar titled *Test Information and Distribution Engine* (*TIDE*) *Test Settings and the Test Supports/Accommodation Form* will be held on **Thursday, November 17, 2016, from 3:00-4:00 p.m**. This webinar is intended for school and district personnel who will be entering designated supports and accommodations in TIDE. Information will be provided about using the new TIDE testing setting system for entering designated supports and accommodations for students and how it relates to information included on the <u>CSDE Test Supports/Accommodation form</u> for the Smarter Balanced Interim and Summative Assessments and the CMT/CAPT Science Assessments. Information will be provided for entering designated supports and accommodations for individual students, as well as groups of students.

# **CMT and CAPT Science Results**

Results for the 2016 Connecticut Mastery Test (CMT) and Connecticut Academic Performance Test (CAPT) Science are now available on <u>EdSight</u> under the Performance link. Interactive reports are available at the school, district and state levels. The <u>CMT/CAPT Science Report Notes</u> help provide guidance and general information about the science assessments including how to interpret the scores. Additional information can be found in the <u>CMT and CAPT Science Program Overview</u>.

As a reminder, starting in spring 2017 the CMT and CAPT Science will be administered online for almost all students. Braille and Large Print versions of the test will still be available for the CMT and CAPT Science.

Also, starting with the spring 2017 administration, text-to-speech (TTS) will be available to all students as a designated support. Designated supports are those features available for use by any student for whom the need has been indicated by an educator (or team of educators with parent/guardian and student). See the current version of the <u>Assessment Guidelines</u> for further details about the use of TTS for the CMT and CAPT Science.

# **English Language Proficiency Testing**

The annual English Language Proficiency (ELP) testing window will run from January 3, through March 10, 2017. This year, **LAS Links**, **Form D will be administered**. As in previous years, the Kindergarten-Grade 2 assessments will be administered using paper and pencil. We encourage districts to consider administering the online assessment for Grades 3-12, but paper and pencil is still available at those grade levels. Please note, that for the first time this year, decisions about online versus paper and pencil administration may be made at the **student level**, rather than by grade level, which was past practice.

Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) will be providing four half-day trainings at ACES on **December 14 and 15, 2016**. Sessions will be offered from 8:30-11:30 a.m. or 12:30-3:30 p.m. each day. During the half-day training they will address: scheduling online test sessions, reporting accommodations, and how to successfully administer the LAS Links Online. Districts may send up to three participants to the in-person training. Registration information can be found here. A webinar is also in development and will be available to all districts on demand. # NEW Connecticut SAT School Day ELA and Mathematics Workshops

The College Board, in conjunction with the CSDE, will be providing several train-the-trainer workshops in November and December in the areas of English language arts (ELA) and mathematics. The workshops are intended to prepare school and district staff to train their teams on content of the SAT. Each school (including Approved Private Special Education Programs) can register **two staff members** to participate in a half-day workshop. Department leaders, teachers, curriculum specialists or others who expect to present this training to their respective district teams are invited to attend. # National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) Updates

#### **NAEP Recruitment**

More than 250 Connecticut schools are in the midst of preparing for the 2017 administration of the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). Beginning in the last week of January, selected Connecticut Grade 4 and 8 students will be participating in assessments of mathematics, reading, writing, civics, geography, and U.S. history.

Periodically, NAEP recruits retired Connecticut educators to join their field staff as assessment administrators. These are the individuals who administer the NAEP to our students. If you know people with whom you have worked over the years that might be interested in joining the NAEP for the 2017 administration, please encourage them to apply by visiting <u>www.westat.com/CAREERS</u> and select "Search Field Data Collection Jobs." Search for Connecticut, find the NAEP Assessment Administrator position, and select the "apply to job" button.

#### **NAEP 2015 Science Results Released**

<u>Results</u> from the 2015 administration of the NAEP science assessments were released on October 27, 2016. # **Clarification of TEA User Role for Alternate Assessment**

Every teacher administering the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the CMT or CAPT Science, the Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA) and the CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science must have their own username and password to access the CSDE Portal and the TIDE system. For teachers administering the Alternate Assessments (the CTAA and/or the CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science) the District Administrator (DA), District Coordinator (DC), or School Coordinator (SC) must assign the user role of TEA (Teacher Administering the Alternate) rather than the TE (teacher) role. This will allow these teachers to have the same access permissions as their colleagues with the teacher role, in addition to the critical Alternate Assessment required permissions such as access to the *Directions for Test Administration for the CTAA*.

# **Assessment Guidelines**

The <u>2016-17 Assessment Guidelines</u> is posted to the Student Assessment web page under <u>Special Populations Docu-</u><u>mentation and Resources</u>. This resource provides guidance to Connecticut school district personnel who must make decisions about testing special student populations on the Smarter Balanced Assessments, CMT Science, the CAPT Science, CMT Skills Checklist Science, the CAPT Skills Checklist Science, and the CTAA. These special student populations include students identified as eligible for special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), students identified as disabled under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and students who are identified as English Learners (EL). This decision making also includes general education students who may require additional supports.

The updated <u>2016-17 Test Supports and Accommodations Form</u> used to document the Smarter Balanced and CMT/ CAPT Science supports and accommodations for students with disabilities or English Learners is available.

# Parent Overview of Connecticut's Alternate Assessment System



# Text-to-Speech and Read Aloud Guidelines and Form

The <u>Text-to-Speech and Read Aloud Decision Guidelines 2016-17</u> form must be completed for any student in Grades 3 through 8 who will receive the accommodation of Text-to-Speech or Read Aloud of English language arts/literacy (ELA) reading passages on the Smarter Balanced assessments. This form can be completed online and submitted by clicking on the **SUBMIT FORM** button. The <u>Text-to-Speech and Read Aloud Decision Guidelines 2015-16</u> created by Smarter Balanced will provide you with information about determining if a student qualifies to receive this accommodation.

# Managing Student Test Settings in TIDE

The <u>Managing Student Test Settings in TIDE</u> brochure provides a brief overview on how to manage student test settings in TIDE. Students' embedded accommodations, non-embedded accommodations, and designated supports must be set in TIDE prior to test administration for these settings to be reflected in the online test delivery system.
