### **District Test Coordinator Workshops**

District Test Coordinator Workshops are scheduled for January 18, 19, and 20, 2017, at the Institute of Technology and Business Development (ITBD) in New Britain. # **Connecticut SAT School Day Updates**

#### SAT Practice Tests

Schools can access full length SAT practice tests for students from the <u>College Board's web site</u>. Practice tests are also available for students using <u>MP3</u> or <u>Screen Reader or Assistive Technology</u>. Schools can also request large print or Braille SAT practice tests for students by contacting the <u>College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD)</u>. Additionally, students may access free online SAT practice through <u>Khan Academy</u>.

### **Opening of Data Entry Interface**

The Data Entry Interface (DEI) application in TIDE is now open. Teachers Administering the Alternate (TEAs) should submit the <u>CTAA and CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science Eligibility & Learner Characteristics Inventory (LCI)</u> prior to March 17, 2017, in the DEI to register their students for participation in either alternate assessment. A paper copy of the LCI may be downloaded.

#### **New Resources Available for Alternate Assessments**

The <u>2017 Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA) Test Administration Manual</u> is now available on the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal. This manual provides information about policies and procedures for TEAs and School and District Coordinators to prepare for the administration of the 2017 Connecticut Alternate Assessment for English language arts and mathematics.

The CTAA Assessing Students who are Blind, Deaf or Deaf-Blind; Additional Guidance for Test Administration Manual is now available on the CSDE Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal. This guidance document provides additional guidance for administering the CTAA and is intended to be used in conjunction with the required, secure CTAA Directions for Test Administration (DTA). The document includes tasks to complete before, during, and after the assessment, strategies to enhance access to the CTAA, and appendices with information for accessing the Open-Response (OR) Foundational Reading items in Grades 3 and 4 and additional resources for TEAs working with students who are Blind, Deaf, or Deaf-Blind.

The <u>Student Response Check for Paper Administration</u> is now available on the CSDE Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal. The online form of the CTAA Student Response Check (SRC) is available in the Test Delivery System. The SRC is a task that needs to be completed prior to testing by the TEA to evaluate a student's response capabilities. This content-neutral task provides an opportunity to observe and confirm the student's mode of response.

The <u>Connecticut Accessing Participation Reports: CTAA and CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science Eligibility & Learner Characteristics Inventory (LCI) Brochure is now available on the CSDE Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal. This document provides instructions for how to extract participation reports for the CTAA and CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science Eligibility & LCI in the Test Information and Distribution Engine (TIDE). Submission of the LCI is required for eligible students with significant cognitive disabilities prior to administering the following alternate assessments: CTAA for English language arts and mathematics, the CMT Skills Checklist Science, and the CAPT Skills Checklist Science. Reviewing these participation reports can ensure teachers and administrators have registered students for either alternate assessment by tracking the LCI and Skills Checklist Science submissions.</u>









### **Special Populations Updates**

The <u>How to Access the Data Entry interface (DEI) Brochure</u> is now available on the CSDE Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal. The document provides instructions describing how to access the DEI in order to submit the CTAA and CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science Eligibility & LCI and the CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science. The submission of the LCI is required prior to administering either alternate assessment (CTAA or CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science).

#### Alternate Assessment System Training

Any teacher administering an alternate assessment must complete and pass the CSDE required training that is provided prior to test administration. The <u>2016-17 CSDE Alternate Assessment System Training</u> continues to be available as an online course. This training qualifies participants to administer either alternate assessment for a three-year period, therefore, individuals who passed the course in 2014-15, 2015-16 or 2016-17 are eligible to administer the CTAA and the CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science in 2017. District Administrators may access the list of Trained Teachers in TIDE.

### **New Designated Support**

<u>Simplified test directions</u> is a designated support allowable across all grades on Smarter Balanced assessments. Designated supports can be provided to any student, as long as an informed educator or group of educators determines it is appropriate. Students with difficulties in auditory processing, short-term memory, attention, or decoding may benefit from having test directions simplified for them. This designated support may require testing in a separate setting to avoid distracting other test takers.











## **VEW Updates on English Learners**

### **English Language Proficiency Testing**

The Every Student Succeeds Act (Sec. 1111.i) requires that all English Learners be assessed annually with an English language proficiency (ELP) assessment. The annual ELP testing window is from January 3, through March 10, 2017. This year, LAS Links, Form D will be administered. As in previous years, the Kindergarten-Grade 2 assessments will be administered using paper and pencil. Districts have the option to administer the assessment to Grades 3-12 using an online platform or a paper and pencil assessment. Decisions about assessing students using the online versus paper and pencil administration may be made at the **student level**. If you have questions, please e-mail Janet Stuck.

#### Accommodations for the LAS Links

In our continuing efforts to support ELs, the CSDE will collect accommodations information for dually identified students (i.e., English learners who have an individualized education plan (IEP) or 504 Plan). During this information gathering stage, collaboration between staff supporting English learners, students who are receiving special education services and students with Section 504 plans will be essential. Only LAS Links Category 3 accommodations will be recorded if eligible students will be using one or more of the following accommodations:

- Alternate Response Options (Assistive Technology or Alternate or Augmentative Communication);
- Braille;
- Large Print;
- Read Aloud for Reading Passages;
- Scribe;
- Sign Language;
- Speech-to-Text; and
- Text-to-Speech.

Please note that these accommodations parallel those identified and used on the Smarter Balanced and CMT/CAPT Science assessments. At this time, the CSDE does not require any additional documentation, or a Special Accommodations Petition for Read Aloud for passages or Scribe on the annual LAS Links assessment. ## **VEW Updates on English Learners**

### **English Mastery Standard**

English learners (ELs) who achieve the criteria specified below are considered to have attained English mastery and, therefore, districts must change their EL status to "N" in the October 2017 Collection of the Public School Information System (PSIS). For two years beginning in school year 2017-18, these students are considered "monitored former ELs" and may receive English language supports that are deemed appropriate by the district.

Deaf and non-verbal ELs can achieve mastery by receiving a score of 4 or higher on the three LAS Links subtests on which they are assessed. If an EL is Deaf or non-verbal and will not participate in an applicable subtest in the English Language Proficiency (ELP) assessment, you **must** contact Janet Stuck by e-mail at <u>janet.stuck@ct.gov</u> or 860-713-6837 to discuss the student's individual testing needs.

## **Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Fees for Low Income Students**

Since 2012, the CSDE has applied and received a federal grant from the USDE to cover the partial cost of AP exam fees for low income students in Connecticut. For the past several years, the CSDE has also used state funds to cover all remaining AP exam fees for low income students. The CSDE has worked with the College Board to pay directly for these exams on behalf of schools. The existing grant program from the USDE ended in 2016 and will be replaced by another grant, Title IV, Part A. The plans for the distribution and allocation of this new grant have not been determined. However, the CSDE has pledged to cover the costs for AP exams for low income students for the May 2017 administration. Information will be shared soon regarding the plans for 2018 and beyond.
