

Connecticut SAT School Day SSD Accommodations Window: November 12, 2024- January 13, 2025.

To access SSD Online, Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators will need to log on to: <a href="mailto:ssdonline.collegeboard.org">ssdonline.collegeboard.org</a>. If you are a new SSD Coordinator and do not have an account, you will need to request an account through the <a href="College Board">College Board</a> and complete the <a href="SSD Coordinator Form">SSD Coordinator Form</a>. Students may have already been approved by the College Board for test accommodations if requests were made for other assessments such as the PSAT or SAT. Once students are approved for accommodations, they will remain available for use on subsequent SAT administrations including the CT SAT School Day. However, it is important for SSD Coordinators to review these accommodations to ensure they are still needed and supported per the student's implemented Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Section 504 Plan. SSD Coordinators should meet with their students with IEP and Section 504 Plans early on to review accommodations and determine the appropriateness of digital alternatives available on the new and shortened SAT. SSD Coordinators may need to submit new accommodation requests or make changes to those already approved in SSD from past test administrations.

For a listing of available universal features, EL/ML language supports, and accommodations for students with IEPs/Section 504 Plans, refer to the <u>CT SAT School Accessibility Chart</u>. If your EL/ML is eligible and needs 50% time and one-half on the CT-SAT School Day, accommodation requests should be made in SSD prior to January 13, 2025.

Refer to the <u>Accommodations Crosswalk for the CT SAT School Day</u> for a comparative guide of accommodations on the legacy paper-pencil assessments to the digital SATs. This resource will help PPTs, Section 504 Teams, and SSD Coordinators identify the digital accommodation based on student need.

Educators are encouraged to arrange time for students to trial their accommodations and assistive technology (AT), if applicable, early in the year using the College Board's digital <u>Practice Tests on Bluebook</u>. This allows SSD Coordinators to make timely accommodation requests/changes within the SSD submission window, if applicable, to promote optimal test conditions on test day.

**SSD Form Upload for Documentation Requests:** Use this <u>form</u> as documentation if requested by SSD Online. This form does not take the place of evidence that may be needed for paper test requests.

# **Connecticut Alternates Assessment Training and Resources**

The required, annual, online Connecticut Alternate Assessment System Training for math, ELA, and science is now available on the portal for teachers who have the primary responsibility for assessing students with significant cognitive disabilities on the Connecticut Alternate Assessment System. Here's what to know:

Teachers must be assigned a TEA user role in TIDE (this role also applies to teachers in Grades K-12 administering CAAELP). Once training and the associated quiz are completed, trained status will be reflected on their user dashboard. Please note, this training is specific for the CTAA and CTAS.

# Connecticut Alternate Assessment of English Language Proficiency (CAAELP) Resources

DAs, ELACs, Special Education Administrators, and educators can access CAAELP resources on the <u>CAAELP</u> Resources page on the <u>Connecticut Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal</u>.

#### **CAAELP Practice Tests:**

- The CSDE encourages educators responsible for administering the CAAELP to access the CAAELP Practice Tests with eligible students.
- Test Administrator Directions and Scoring Rubrics Booklets (located on the main <u>CAAELP Resources webpage</u>) should be used for the administration of the CAAELP Practice Test and are available for Grades Kindergarten, 1, 2-3, 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12. The domain and grade specific practice tests may be accessed on the <u>Connecticut Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal</u>. Sign in as Guest User/Guest Session. Educators can set accommodations while signing onto the practice site.

<u>Domain Exemptions</u>: The CAAELP Domain Exemption window will be open from December 2, 2024, to February 28, 2025.
