<b>Discussion Protocol for Faculty Meetings</b>		
Protocol	Roles for Administrators and Teachers	
Groupings	Administrator: Suggest having a variety of grade levels and disciplines in each group. Teachers: Four teachers per group.	
Introduction (3 minutes)	Administrator: Introduce Discussion Focus question. Teachers: Teachers have three minutes to think about their practice and write initial notes in the discussion graphic organizer.	
<b>Discussion</b> (8 minutes)	<b>Teachers:</b> Each person has two minutes to share their ideas and notes with the group. Those listening should be taking "listening notes" and asking any clarifying questions.	
<b>Reflection</b> (2 minutes)	<b>Teachers:</b> After hearing from all members of the group, each teacher compares their initial ideas with their listening notes to write a brief reflection. Reflection should include any new or enhanced learning that was gained through the collaborative conversation.	
Whole Group Share (3 minutes)	<b>Administrator:</b> Calls on two to three teachers to share take-aways from activity. The first time using this protocol, the administrator may want to lead a discussion with teachers on how it felt for them to go through this process as a learner and how they could use this protocol in their classrooms.
