The meeting was held online and in-person at CT DEEP Headquarters, 79 Elm Street, Hartford.


- •The meeting came to order at 1:35 p.m.
- •The March 2023 Meeting Minutes were approved on a motion by Bill Abbott, seconded by Jeff Morrissette.
- •Introductions and welcomes; discussion that as identified at the last meeting the plan was to meet in person at DESPP in Middletown with a remote option, though due to construction at that building that meeting place will begin with the next meeting.
- Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant Training Activities updates: Jeff Morrissette providedan update on training courses.
- •Update on planning for this year's full-scale interagency exercise in DEMHS Region 1: Bill Seward provided an overview of the planning for this year's full-scale interagency exercise that will occur in DEMHS Region 1 September 7, with a tabletop exercise the previous day, September 6. The tabletop exercise will develop the Incident Action Plan for implementation the next day. Various scenarios are being considered that reflect the types of oils and chemicals managed in the region and the forms of transportation in the region.
- •Summary of April 2023 National SERC meeting: Diane Duva presented an overview of the presentation she provided remotely for the National SERC meeting identifying the activities of the CT SERC.
- •Summary of <u>EPA's National Survey of SERCs</u> published April 2023: Diane Duva presented an overview of the EPA national survey and its findings.
- •Commission members discussed strategies for updating LEPC status and plans; Bill Turner identified the county model in Pennsylvania and discussion occurred among members regarding ground truthing the regional associations actually in place such as regional teams, the Capitol Region Emergency Planning Committee, and other examples of local committees consisting of more than one town. 

2022 Toxics Release Inventory (TRI) Preliminary Data Available

Preliminary TRI data for 2022 are now available. These data cover chemical waste management, including releases, and pollution prevention activities that occurred during 2022 at more than 20,000 industrial and federal facilities across the country. You can use the preliminary data to locate facilities that reported to TRI for 2022 and learn which chemicals those facilities managed as waste and in what quantities. The 2022 preliminary data will be updated periodically in September to reflect any revisions and late submissions from facilities. Access the preliminary data via the TRI website.

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CSB Calls on Chemical Companies to Prepare for Harsh Hurricane Season

This is the first survey of the SERCs that EPA has conducted. However, in 1994, 1999, and 2008, EPA conducted surveys of the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs). The survey summarized in this report was distributed to SERCs in each state, territory, and the District of Columbia. Along with the survey questions on how each provision of EPCRA is currently being implemented, EPA requested the SERCs to provide certain information about their LEPCs, including whether they are active or inactive and whether they have an updated emergency plan. In addition, the survey requested states to provide their priorities and reasons for not meeting their priorities, as well as challenges, best practices, and successes. Furthermore, the survey included questions related to the Toxics Release Inventory (TRI) program and usage of software and other EPA resources available for planners and responders.
