EMERGENCY PLANNING AND COMMUNITY RIGHT-TO-KNOW ACT (EPCRA)

TIER II REPORTS

- Tier II Chemical Inventory Reports provide state and local officials and the public with specific information on the amounts and location of hazardous chemicals at a facility during the previous calendar year to inform preparedness and planning.
- Availability of information increases effectiveness of coordination between state and local officials so that communities are better prepared for chemical emergencies.

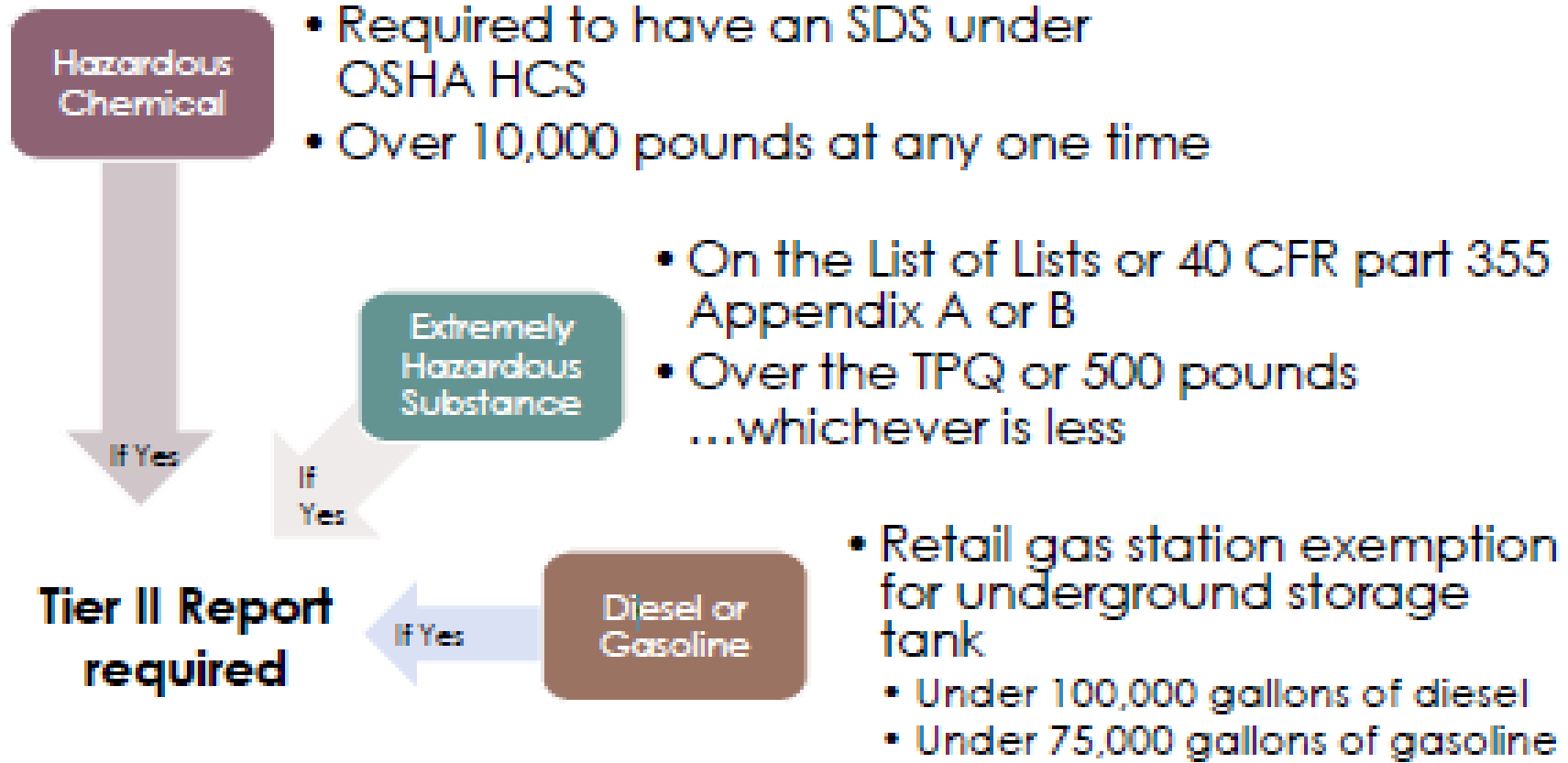

CONNECTICUT REQUIREMENTS

Chemicals you are required to report:

Hazardous Chemicals, Extremely Hazardous Substances, or a mixture containing these chemicals.

Hazardous Chemicals require OSHA Safety Data Sheets (SDSs)

Extremely Hazardous Substances (EHSs) are identified in the EPA List of Lists

CAMEO Chemicals can be used to search for EHSs: <https://cameochemicals.noaa.gov/>

For each reporting year (January 1 through December 31), the EPCRA **Tier II Form** is due no later than March 1 of the following year.

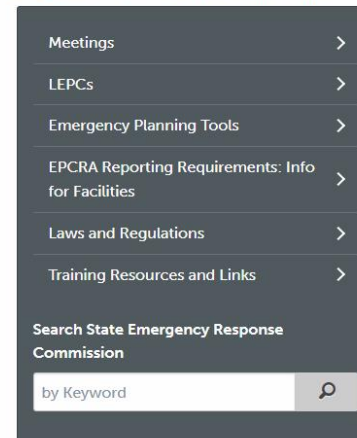

Key Info to Provide

- The complete name and address of the location of your facility (include the full street address or state road, city, county, state and zip code), latitude and longitude.
- A basic site plan.
- The name, title, phone number and email address of at least one local individual that can act as a referral if emergency responders need assistance in responding to a chemical accident at your facility. You must also provide an emergency phone number which will be available 24 hours a day, every day.
