
TIER II REPORTS

- Tier II Chemical Inventory Reports provide state and local officials and the public with specific information on the amounts and location of hazardous chemicals at a facility during the previous calendar year to inform preparedness and planning.
- Availability of information increases effectiveness of coordination between state and local officials so that communities are better prepared for chemical emergencies.



SUBMIT TIER II REPORTS DIRECTLY TO EACH OF THESE State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) and/or

Tribal Emergency Response Commission (TERC)

Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) and/or

Tribal Emergency Planning Committee (TEPC)

Local Fire Department

Facilities must directly submit your Tier II Report and Attachments to your Local Emergency Response Commission and your local Fire Department

CONNECTICUT REQUIREMENTS

Tutorial for How to Submit Tier II Reports Online in Tier II Manager For each reporting year (January 1 through December 31), the EPCRA Tier II Form is due no later than March 1 of the following year.

1. Report your information to the CT SERC/CT DEEP via the

Hazconnect[®] Tier II Manager system

2. Send your Tier II Report, along with the Site Plan and any other attachments, directly to your <u>Local Emergency Planning Committee</u>

3. Send your Tier II Report, along with the Site Plan and any other attachments, directly to your local fire department.

The <u>LEPC contacts list</u> is on the <u>LEPC</u> page. The LEPC and many town-specific fire departments are also pre-populated in the Hazconnect Tier II Manager reporting system.

Key Info to Provide

The complete name and address of the location of your facility (include the full street address or state road, city, county, state and zip code), latitude and longitude.

≻A basic Site Plan.

> The name, title, phone number and email address of at least one local individual that can act as a referral if emergency responders need assistance in responding to a chemical accident at your facility. You must also provide an emergency phone number which will be available 24 hours a day, every day.

Hazardous Chemical Inventory Reporting

EPCRA Sections 311-312

For any hazardous chemical used or stored in the workplace, facilities must maintain a safety data sheet (SDS) (formerly known as material safety data sheet, MSDS). Facilities must submit the safety data sheet (SDS) or a list of hazardous chemicals to their State or Tribal Emergency Response Commission (SERC or TERC), Local or Tribal Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC or TEPC), and local fire department.

Facilities must also submit an annual inventory of these chemicals by March 1 of each year to their State or Tribal Emergency Response Commission (SERC or TERC), Local or Tribal Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC or TEPC), and local fire department. The information submitted by facilities must be made available to the public.

<u>What facilities are covered?</u>

- What is a hazardous chemical?

- How do I submit a Tier I or Tier II Inventory Report?

What facilities are covered?

Any facility that is required to maintain SDSs under the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations for hazardous chemicals stored or used in the workplace.



HAZCONNECT TIER II MANAGER PLATFORM

To use the Hazconnect[®] Tier II Manager platform please first register for a system user account.

This allows us to link your facility's account data to your user account so that you can work from your existing information when submitting your next report.

Here's how to register as a new User.

- 1. Sign up as a User at this link: <u>https://connecticut.hazconnect.com/Account/Login.aspx</u>
- 2. Click on the **REGISTER button** in the middle of the page.
- 3. Choose **Reporting Facility/Business User** then click Next.


4. Enter your information. Please be sure you enter information in the "Facility Details" text box at the bottom of the screen to inform CT DEEP of the facility for which you are submitting. Once your username is linked to your facility then the new year's report will be pre-populated with the information from the previous report.

5. Once your User account is approved, you will receive a notification and then you can begin submitting the next year's report. If you don't see previously submitted reports in your account, please contact us at <u>DEEP.CTEPCRA@ct.gov</u>.
