

Need Help Standing in Line at the Polls?

Ask For: A Line Placeholder



What is it? A line placeholder is an in-person accessibility option available to voters with difficulty standing in line at the polls.

Accommodates Voters With:

- Limited mobility
- Temporary or chronic physical limitations like pain, fatigue, or trouble balancing that make it difficult to stand in line



How Does it Work?

- Alert the Moderator of your polling place that you are having difficulty standing in line.
- Request to have your place in line held and to be notified when it is your turn to vote.
- While you wait, you may ask to be directed to a chair.
- To reduce your wait, you may ask to be moved to the front of the line.
- You do not need to provide any medical documentation to request accommodations for standing in line.



Where is it Available? All towns may offer line placeholders, but they are not required to under Connecticut law. Contact your Registrar of Voters as soon as possible to request in your town.
