Notice to Head Moderator

- 1 Preliminary Report: Head Moderator or Registrar of Voters is requested to FAX ALL RETURN FORMS to (880) 609-6127 (alternates: 609-6230, 609-6131) as soon as possible after polls close. This Fax report does not replace the required official filing (see below).
- 2 MANDATORY OFFICIAL FILING: Head Moderator must make a duplicate set of all returns and sign both sets. Head Moderator must seal and deliver one complete signed set of these returns immediately by hand to the Secretary of the State, Election Services Division, 2nd floor, 30 Trinity St., Hartford, not later than 8 PM, of the day after election or to the State Police not later than 4PM of the day after election. Alternatively, if Head Moderator faxes the preliminary report, as described above, Head Moderator can send a complete signed set of returns by mail to Secretary of the State to be received by the Friday after the election. If late, the moderator must pay a late fee of \$50.
- 3 Head Moderator must deliver the other complete signed set of these returns to the Town Clerk on or before the day after the election.
