My Guide to Voting While Incarcerated in CT

Can I vote in Connecticut?

- √ I am 18 or older by election day
- ✓ I am a U.S. citizen and a resident of a town in Connecticut
- ✓ I am not currently incarcerated for a felony
- If all three of these statements are true, you can to vote in CT.

 Do not register if you are not a U.S. citizen, your residence is not in Connecticut, you are currently incarcerated for a felony, or will not be 18 by election day.



If I can vote: who do I talk to?

Your Unit Counselor or facility's Re-Entry Counselor can give you the address of your Registrar of Voters and Town Clerk offices. You can correspond with these office for **purposes below**.

I want to register to vote!

- ✓ Voter registration applications are centrally located at facilities for easy access. Ask your unit counselor to direct you to where to find them at your facility.
- ✓ Fill it out. Then mail it to the **Registrar of Voters** in the Connecticut town where you last lived (called your "hometown" in this flyer) before the registration deadline, shown at the bottom of this flyer.

NOTE: You are **not** a voter until your application is approved by the Registrar of Voters.

You should get a confirmation within 3 weeks. If you do not, contact the Registrar of Voters office in your hometown.

I want to vote in the next election!

- 1. Write to your hometown Town Clerk office to ask for an absentee ballot application.
- 2. The Town Clerk will mail you an absentee ballot application. Fill out the application. Then mail it back to your hometown Town Clerk.
- 3. Once your application is processed, an absentee ballot will be mailed to you. Complete the ballot
- **4.** Place the ballot inside the inner envelope (envelope B). Sign, date, and seal the inner envelope.
- **5.** Place the inner envelope inside the outer envelope. Seal and mail it.

Refer to the instructions provided to make sure you are following election laws.

Key Dates: 2024 Primary Election

You can register to vote any time until **July 25**Be sure to ask for your absentee ballot application as soon as you are registered

Once processed, your ballot will arrive after July 23

August 13: Primary Election

Absentee ballots must be received by 8pm

Key Dates: 2024 General Election

You can register to vote any time until **October 18**Be sure to ask for your absentee ballot application as soon as you are registered

Once processed, your ballot will arrive after **October 5**

November 5: General Election

Absentee ballots must be **received** by 8pm
