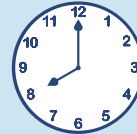
Inspect a

languages other
than English,
where required
by federal or
state law.

Vote free from
coercion or
intimidation by
election
officials or any
others.

Have your
ballot counted
accurately.

Vote by
provisional ballot
if you believe you
are eligible to
vote, but your
name is not on
the voter list.

8



Learn how to
restore voting
rights after a
felony
conviction.

Vote
independently
and in
privacy,
regardless of
ability.

New for 2026: Stronger Protections at Election Sites

- Limits when law enforcement officers may be present near election sites.
- Restricts face coverings that conceal a person's identity near election sites, with limited exceptions.
