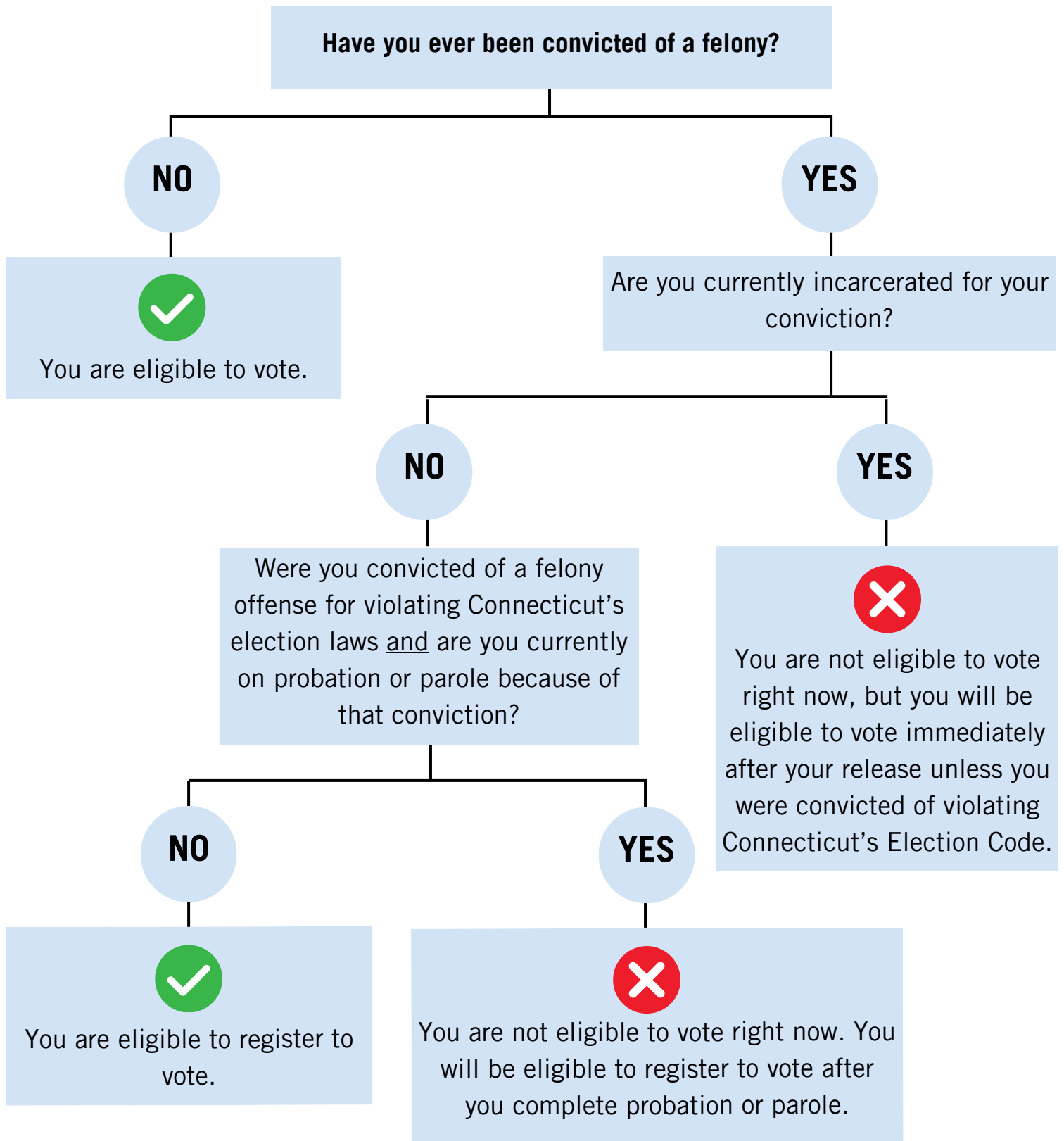


Am I eligible to vote in Connecticut if I've been incarcerated?



In Connecticut, you lose your right to vote if you are convicted of a felony.

People who were incarcerated for felony convictions regain their voting rights immediately after their release, while people who have been convicted of election offenses must complete any terms of probation and parole.

Pretrial detention, misdemeanors, probation, and parole do not restrict your voting rights.
