## YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

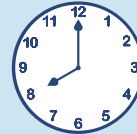
Inspect a

before voting.

Receive  
instructions on  
how to operate  
voting  
equipment.

Vote if you're  
in line when  
the polls are  
closing.

4



Ask and receive  
assistance in  
languages other  
than English,  
where required  
by federal or  
state law.

5



Vote free from  
coercion or  
intimidation by  
election  
officials or any  
others.

6



Have your  
ballot counted  
accurately.

7



Vote by  
provisional ballot  
if you believe you  
are eligible to  
vote, but your  
name is not on  
the voter list.

8



Learn how to  
restore voting  
rights after a  
felony  
conviction.

Vote  
independently  
and in  
privacy,  
regardless of  
ability.

### New for 2026: Stronger Protections at Election Sites

- Limits when law enforcement officers may be present near election sites.
- Restricts face coverings that conceal a person's identity near election sites, with limited exceptions.
