SECRETARY MERRILL RELEASES PRELIMINARY TOP OFFICE RESULTS FROM MUNICIPAL PRIMARY

SECRETARY OF THE STATE REPORTS RECOUNTS TAKING PLACE IN EAST HAVEN, WEST HAVEN, AND KILLINGWORTH FOR VARIOUS MUNICIPAL OFFICES

HARTFORD: Secretary of the State Denise Merrill today released preliminary results for top office from yesterday's municipal primary elections in 22 towns in Connecticut. Secretary Merrill is also reporting that there will be close election recounts taking place in East Haven, West Haven, and Killingworth for various municipal offices. Connecticut state law requires an automatic recount of election results when the margin between the top two candidates is less than 0.5% of all votes cast, or less than 20 votes. By law, the town clerk must call the recount and the town has 7 days from the date of the primary to re-run the machine totals from the September 10^{th} primary.

"Once again we have seen how close election results can be at the municipal level," said Secretary Merrill, Connecticut's chief elections official. "This really reinforces the idea that every vote truly does count, especially with critical decisions facing our communities such as local budgets and taxes, schools, road construction, environmental protection and other important issues. My office has spoken with town officials where recounts are taking place and we are confident the recounts for these municipal primary races will be conducted smoothly so we will know who all of our candidates will be for November."

Recounts are taking place in the following towns for the following primary results: East Haven (Town Council districts 1-4, Board of Education, Board of Finance), West Haven (Mayor), and Killingworth (Selectman, Town Clerk, Board of Finance, Zoning Board of Appeals, Board of Fire Commissioners, Regional Board of Education). For the vast majority of Connecticut cities and towns, polls will open from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. for the general municipal election on Tuesday, November 5, 2013. Absentee ballots become available for the municipal elections on Friday October 4, 2013 and the deadlines to register to vote are Tuesday October 22nd by mail and Tuesday October 29th in-person

at town offices. Voters can go to the Secretary of the State's website <u>www.sots.ct.gov</u> to see if they are registered to vote and where their polling place is located. Top office primary results can be seen below:
