

**Minutes from the  
Governor's Task Force on Teen Safe Driving**

**Public Health/Multicultural Health Subcommittee**

**Wednesday, February 13, 2008**

Dianne Harnad presented a logic model with regard to this topic for the group's consideration. There was consensus that this subcommittee should work in concert with and be informed by the work of the other subcommittees of the task force, with a strong desire not to work in a vacuum. The basis of the committee should be in statistics and trends.

There was discussion of the effectiveness of graduated driver's licensing for teens from a public health perspective. There is much public health based evidence that related programs and laws with consistent, strong enforcement components, such as Click It or Ticket, do work.

The effectiveness of requiring stickers for novice drivers was questioned, while James Rio stating that such stickers will assist PDs in identifying those holding graduated licenses.

Education from a public health perspective was also discussed, with an emphasis on messaging needing to be presented differently in order to account for cultural backgrounds. Way need to be identified as to how to help parents and guardians meet the obligation of teaching teens to drive.

Discussion also took place surrounding the use of already existing public health coalitions and working to integrate messages developed in this area into already existing networks (such as local drug and alcohol prevention councils).

There was much discussion regarding the possibility of recommending on permanent epidemiological work group to measure the effectiveness of graduated licensing laws, either as they now exist or as they may change upon recommendation from the task force, the Governor and/or the legislature.
