Lisa is from Simsbury, I believe was, uh, 21 a selectman and mayor of Simsbury, so, uh, the Board welcomes you both. I 22 think you'll, uh, find your time here interesting, we hope challenging, um, and, 23 and we welcome you both. 24 25 Lisa H.: Thank you. 26 27 Clare B.: Okay, Agency Report, the fourth item on the agenda. Helen, you have about 3 28 items highlighted on there. You wanna start? 29 30 Yeah, I was just tryin' to help Bill get back in. Uh, staffing... Helen S.: 31 32 Male: I think you... 33 34 Helen S.: Did [inaudible 26:23] get back in, Murray? 35 36 William M.: [Inaudible 26:26]. 37 38 Helen S.: Oh, good. Okay. Um, we [inaudible 26:30] bad news. Um. Loc Pho, our 39 financial manager, has taken a new position at the new FMLA agency that, uh, the 40 governor's team put together, so we are very, very excited for him. He'll be 41 leaving us May 6. Uh, we do have, uh – we filled another retirement examiner 42 position. That person should be starting in a couple a weeks. Uh, Keith is one of 43 our new IT folks. I may have introduced him in the past. Uh, so that's where we 44 are with staffing. Uh. Health insurance update. Everything is running fairly 45 smooth, uh, with our health plans. The, uh – on the website, we have, as you 46 know, information [up there 27:10] about the satisfaction reports and, and how

we're doing, so there's really n-, not much to announce about that. I will say that, um, someone had a question about prior authorizations and they, uh – Anthem, the Medicare Advantage, the, uh, approved first-contact rate is 92 percent, inpatient, .6 and those are generally held up a little bit when they need more information from the provider, um, or there's questions, uh, [inaudible 27:39] more details. Outpatient authorizations are approved, uh, generally [inaudible 27:43] at 97.2 percent. Um. Diagnostic tests averaging about 94.2 percent. And that's the first quarter of 2021. Again, uh, generally, if there is – and I think Terry's on the line, too. If there is a question about a prior authorization, it's generally because there's something – there may not be information from the provider.

Uh, the Express Script plan, we've had a, a little influx of phone calls but, um, other than that, they've managed that well. Uh, as you know, the Anthem Medicare Supplement team moved to a new platform and their calls got – their call time was, uh, a little slow there during, uh, the transition but they've also improved, uh, so they are – uh, kudos to them. They're getting that platform up and running. Um, that's all I have to really, uh, say. It was a very quick meeting today. I wanted to let everybody know that, uh, technology enhancements, uh, our FileNet, uh, program that we've been working on for a little over a year, is going to go live in the next couple a weeks. That is gonna be, uh, instrumental for staff. Um. As you know, we, we, uh, scanned all of our records, over 2000 ft<sup>2</sup> of them and, uh, they're now into a, a file system that we're able to easily maintain. Uh. Loc and the team have built some other, uh, programs to do some workarounds to our so-, pension software system, so kudos to them. They're [out on 29:15] the website. Um. I would share screens and jump around but today, I think we'll just keep goin'. Um. So if you visit the website, you'll see that there's a, a member statement section, uh, to help with the active teachers. They've revamped the pension calculator. Um, it's much improved. Javiel did a great job. It's up and running.

 So everything that, that we've been able to do to work around, uh, you know, our, our minor flaws here tech-, uh, with technology, um, we've been doing, uh, fairly well. We've been working with the IT, uh, optimization team. We hope to provide some self-service in the next, uh, several months so that, um, that will alleviate some pressure from the agency, uh, staff. Uh, the elephant in the room is our pension system that we would really like to get updated, uh, because I think [we've done 30:07] as many workarounds as we possible can to keep it going. Uh, so stayed tuned for that. I'm very positive. But, um, that's all we have. You know. Loc's moving on. We're very excited for him. This is a great opportunity. He'll be very, very missed. Um. But other than that, we — we're, we're doin' okay over here. Clare, did you wanna pick up and just get [inaudible 30:42].

These come from individual teachers, um, and then they come to the Medical Review Committee. They're not always approved, um, because sometimes they need more information. The doctors may send them back both to the teacher and, and say, you know, we, we don't have enough information here, we don't have enough information there. And then when they are, when they are approved and stuff, then they come to us as a part of this report so that these are things that we are going to routinely examine and approve at every single meeting.
