Construction Engineering and Inspection Pamphlet for Consultant Engineers, February 2017 Edition

The Construction Engineering and Inspection Pamphlet for Consultant Engineers has been updated. The revised (February 2017) version shall be used for future projects. The previous (August 2008) version remains valid for existing agreements and those for which the assignment meeting has already been held. However, use of the "CE&I Proposed Staffing Application" form (reference updated pamphlet, p. 19) should begin immediately for existing projects, as this has been identified as a best practice.

The following are key changes incorporated in the updated pamphlet:

Project Lead: The District will specify a project lead (Chief 1, Chief 2, RE 1 or RE2) based upon the size and complexity of the Project as part of the solicitation process. The table below is a guideline.

CLASSIFICATION	PROJECT COMPLEXITY	CONSTRUCTION COST
Resident Engineer 2	High	>\$50MM
Resident Engineer 1	Moderate	\$15MM TO \$60MM
Chief Inspector 2	Average	\$10MM TO \$20MM
Chief Inspector 1	Low	<\$10MM

CE&I Proposed Staffing Application Form: The <u>Consultant</u> shall submit a "CE&I Proposed Staffing Application" for every employee, which summarizes an applicant's experience, credentials and qualifications, in addition to supplying a resume and other documentation.

Qualifications: Information on "Minimum Credentials" for various classifications has been added as follows:

- Certified Construction Manager (CCM) for RE1 and below classifications,
- Engineer-in-Training (EIT) registration for Chief Inspector 2 and below classifications,
- Planning and Scheduling (PSP) certification for Scheduler classification,
- Qualified Compliance Inspector of Stormwater certification or Certified Erosion, Sediment and Stormwater Inspector for projects with a Stormwater Discharge Permit.

Equipment: Unless supplied by the Contractor, or as an allowable direct cost, all equipment for surveying, materials testing and environmental monitoring shall be provided by the Consultant.
