Dear Governor Lamont:

In accordance with §38a-478b (b) of the Connecticut General Statutes, this is to advise you that all managed care organizations have filed the required data, reports and information, with the exception of Harvard Pilgrim Healthcare and HPHC Insurance Company, Inc.

The companies reported a ransomware attack and advised that they wouldn't be able to meet the May 1st deadline for reporting. We advised them to submit what information they could report and we would give them an additional 10 days to report the missing information. They advised us that they cannot meet that date as their systems are still offline and expect to remain that way for 4-6 more weeks. Because of the extraordinary circumstances, we recommend that we extend the remedy due date rather than fining

the company for failure to comply as permitted by C.G.S. 38a-478b. We propose that the remedy due date be extended to 5 business days after their systems are back online, with a request that they reach out to us with updates on the expected timeline every 2 weeks.
