The next CT LAB book club will meet virtually on July 17, 2024, from 11:00 AM to 12:00 PM. The title that we are reading for July is *The Covenant of Water* by Abraham Verghese. This title is available as a Talking Book on cartridge and from BARD as DB 114896. A summary of the book follows:

Spanning the years 1900 to 1977, The Covenant of Water is set in Kerala, on South India's Malabar Coast, and follows three generations of a family that suffers a peculiar affliction: in every generation, at least one person dies by drowning—and in Kerala, water is everywhere. At the turn of the century, a twelve-year-old girl from Kerala's long-existing Christian community, grieving the death of her father, is sent by boat to her wedding, where she will meet her forty-year-old husband for the first time. From this unforgettable new beginning, the young girl—and future

matriarch, known as Big Ammachi—will witness unthinkable changes over the span of her extraordinary life, full of joy and triumph as well as hardship and loss, her faith and love the only constants.
