Dear Secretary Beckham and Chairs and Ranking Members of the Finance, Revenue and Bonding Committee,

CGS 3-21d requires the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to report annually the completion or acceptance of each public works construction project administered by the Division of Construction Services within DAS during the preceding year that (1) has an estimated cost of more than \$10,000 and (2) received any funding from the proceeds of state general obligations bonds.

The report must include, for each project, the (1) actual cost if known, or the estimated total cost; (2) amount, if any, required to be held in retainage and the reason for the retainage; and (3) amount of any bonds authorized by the State Bond Commission and allotted by the Governor that remain unexpended.

Below, you will find the FY 2023 report information, which shows there are no unexpended funds for the closed projects:
