Commissioner's Corner



Happy Earth Day! As you may know, sustainability is a core priority of the Department of Administrative Services and the Lamont-Bysiewicz administration at large. We support environmental stewardship in several obvious ways, such as a building code that adopts the International Energy Conservation Code, significant investments in solar installations on state

buildings, construction of new, net-zero energy buildings, and the ongoing electrification of the state fleet. We also support sustainability in several less obvious ways, including programs to divert food waste away from landfills.

Food Waste Prevention



In early April, DAS and DEEP recognized Food Waste Prevention Week by sharing information on how we can do our part to reduce food waste, prevent spoilage, and save money in our personal lives.

DAS has implemented an organics and food waste program at its two largest state office buildings, 450 Columbus Boulevard and 165 Capitol Avenue, to divert all organic waste to compost bins, which are located on all floors in each break room.

We have contracted with Blue Earth Compost Inc. to collect compost weekly. Since implementation, DAS has composted enough waste to mitigate CO₂ emissions equivalent to more than 7,000 miles driven by the average car.

We operate the Small or Minority Business Enterprise (SBE/MBE) Certification program, which, among other things, assists Connecticut small, women, minority and disabled-owned businesses in identifying procurement opportunities in state government.
