April is Child Abuse Prevention Month with the theme. **"Powered by Hope. Strengthened by Prevention."** 


A fundamental belief we share is that **children** are **best supported by families** and **families** are **best supported by the community.** Seeking support truly is a sign of strength and we must continue to **lift the stigma** associated with asking for help.

"Prevention" brings with it many connotations from "preventing" involvement with DCF to

"preventing" a family from going deeper into an existing system. It is all our responsibility to provide family-centered and timely supports to those we serve.

To reinforce this philosophy, **Prevention is now the 6<sup>th</sup> Strategic Focus Area** of the Department.





Connecticut has a vast array of supports and services for families - the question is how do we ensure all members of our communities - families, professionals and concerned citizens - know what is available? April is also **Safe Havens Awareness Month**. Passed in 2000, the law allows a parent, who does not believe they can care for their newborn, to **voluntarily give up custody of an infant age 30 days or younger** to the staff of an emergency room and remain anonymous. DCF will then place the baby in a pre-approved adoptive home. To date, **57 children have been safely placed**. Read more here: <u>Safe Havens</u>

Ken Mysogland is our Chief Administrator of External Affairs, and he is also a Professor of Social Work at


**Sacred Heart University**. Congratulations to Ken for being awarded the "ACCESS Ally Award" given to the faculty member who has done the most to support students with disabilities.

In a span of less than 48 hours, I flew over 2,000 miles to highlight Connecticut's work at the Child Welfare


