SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT: Interview / Statement of Robert Calzone (AMR) Supervisory Paramedic

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ACTION TAKEN:

On May 9, 2017 at approximately 1712 hours, Supervisory Paramedic, Robert Calzone #3013 was dispatched to an officer-involved shooting located at 1000 Park Avenue Bridgeport, CT. Mr. Calzone is currently a certified paramedic and on the evening of May 9th, he was working in his official capacity for American Medical Response (AMR). Mr. Calzone provided medical attention to an individual ultimately identified as Jayson Negrón, date of birth; July 17, 1995.

On the above-mentioned date, I conducted an interview with (AMR) American Medical Response, Supervisory Paramedic, Robert Calzone. Introductions were made and the purpose of the interview was

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conveyed. Calzone agreed to provide me with a sworn written statement. Calzone voluntarily attested to the following summarized verbal and sworn written statement:

Robert Calzone relayed that he is currently employed as a full time Supervisory Paramedic with American Medical Response (AMR), and has (30+) thirty-plus years of experience and service within the Emergency Medical Services Field, working his way up to the rank of Supervisory Paramedic. Mr. Calzone relayed that he has been witness to multiple shootings and triaged those victims who have suffered from gun-shot wounds.

On the evening on May 9th, Mr. Calzone relayed that at approximately 1705 hours, he responded to the area of 1000 Park Avenue, in the City of Bridgeport regarding shots fired involving the Bridgeport Police Department and as a result there were multiple victims as reported by the dispatcher. Mr. Calzone relayed that he arrived on scene at approximately 1709 hours, and was the first-responder on scene but was advised by dispatch that an (AMR) ambulance was en route from the Town of Fairfield. When Mr. Calzone relayed he observed what appeared to be a male victim lying prone on the roadway perpendicular to the curb with a Bridgeport Police Officer standing over him. The Bridgeport Police Officer advised him that there was a second victim on the other side of the car. Mr. Calzone relayed that based on his (30+) thirty years of training and experience and being the only first responder on scene to what appeared to be a (MCI) Mass Casualty Incident, he visually determined that the male victim later identified as Jayson Negrón, date of birth; September 16, 2001, was deceased. This conclusion was made by Paramedic Calzone based on a number of factor's to include: Negrón's ashen gray skin color which would have been indicative with large amounts of blood loss, the lack of a pulse, both pupils ultimately being fixed and dilated and the lack of respirations, Mr. Calzone relayed that within close proximity to Negrón's body he observed a large amount of pooled blood near the curb, indicating Negrón had lost approximately (2) two litters of blood.

Based on the facts and circumstances that were presented to Calzone at the time, he pronounced Negrón deceased at 1712 hours, (Signal 12). Mr. Calzone relayed at that point he was still the only first responder on scene when he moved onto victim #2 later identified as _____, date of birth; _____ Mr. Calzone relayed that as he was trying to identify victim #2 the ambulance crew arrived on scene at which time he released his control to Paramedic, Andrew Levine. Mr. Calzone relayed that he stayed on scene for approximately (5) five minutes to ensure no further medical assistance was needed. Mr. Calzone relayed that when he arrived on scene the area had not been roped off with yellow police tape, however by the time he left the police officer on guard had to move the yellow tape in order for him to exit the scene.
