- iv. Training with repetition and varied presentation approaches may be more costly than anticipated. Hopefully, the incentives will help with this and the one-time safety net is an added benefit.
- v. Will there be an evaluation of the training upon completion of the training which asks the staff members if they feel fully informed about the initiative and that they support its efforts.
- vi. Are parents or individuals living with in-home supports aware of the Notices of Opportunity. Are case managers making families aware and are newsletters alerting people of the opportunities.
- vii. It would be helpful to list all the other transportation options that would be deemed unworkable before Lyft or Uber would be approved.
- viii. It is hopeful to say that providers will backfill any openings from the very long emergency list, but there is certainly no guarantee that this will happen. it is essential that some plan and possibly incentives be put in place in the very near future for population.
- ix. Are there any clear guidelines for handling missteps by individuals embracing their new found independence?
- x. The Dept. of Housing site states that the waiting list for RAP's is currently closed and that there is always a long waitlist whenever it is opened again. Will this effect this initiative?
