Statute Responsibilities

Principles To Guide Family Support Programs

The following principles should be used to guide supports to families.

- Family support programs respect families as equal partners.
- Family supports build on families' strengths and respond to the needs of the entire family.
- Families are recognized as valuable resources to their children, other families, their communities, and to the programs that support them.
- Family supports acknowledge the unique cultural and personal identities of families.
- Family supports are rooted in communities and help communities to be responsive to all their members.

- Family supports are fair, responsive, and accountable to the families they serve.
- Family supports help families to use and strengthen both formal and informal sources of support.
- Family supports have the flexibility to respond to changing situations within families and their communities.
- Family support programs model the principles of family support in all they do.
