## DDS Legislative Update – January 12, 2015

### This legislative update is divided into three sections:

- Bills Proposed by DDS
- Senate Proposed, Raised and Committee Bills Being Followed by DDS
- House Proposed, Raised and Committee Bills Being Followed by DDS

**Note:** This update is not a comprehensive list of bills before the Connecticut General Assembly. DDS is tracking and assessing the bills listed below for their potential impact on DDS consumers, families and guardians, DDS employees and DDS providers.

# This legislative update shows some of the bills that are being tracked by DDS this session.

As the legislative session goes forward, bills will be referred from legislative committees to the House or Senate. The House or Senate then may refer the bills to other committees or chose to vote on them. In these updates, the last action taken on a bill will be in **bold.** For a bill to become law, both the House and the Senate must vote favorably on it by June 3, 2015 at midnight, and the Governor must sign the bill into law.

#### **Key to Legislative Terminology:**

**Vote to Draft** means a Proposed Bill will be drafted as a Committee Bill.

**Reserved for Subject Matter Public Hearing** means a bill will have a Public Hearing but the date of the Public Hearing is still to be determined.

**Change of Reference** means that the original committee is moving the bill to another committee without a Joint Favorable action.

**JF** means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate.

**JF Change of Reference** means the committee reported the bill favorably to another committee.

**JFS** means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate but with substitute language.

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A File Number (**File No.**) is a unique number given to a bill once it has reached the House or Senate Floor. A file copy of a bill with the file number has a plain-language description of what the bill's provisions do, written by the Office of Legislative Research and a fiscal note that explains what a bill would cost or save to implement, written by the Office of Fiscal Analysis.

A House or Senate Calendar Number (**House or Senate Cal. No.**) is also a unique number that is given to a bill once it reaches the House or Senate Floor. This number is used to hold the bill's place on either the House or Senate Calendar. If the bill is a House bill (H.B. 5000 or higher) or a Senate bill (S.B.1 to 4999) it first gets a Calendar Number

from the chamber the bill originated in. Once a House bill is passed in the House, it goes on to the Senate where it receives a Senate Calendar Number. Likewise once a Senate bill (with a Senate Calendar Number) passes the Senate, it goes to the House and receives a House Calendar Number.

## • Senate Proposed, Raised and Committee Bills Being Followed by the Department of Developmental Services

Proposed S.B. No. 15 SEN. CRISCO, 17th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR PEDIATRIC AUTOIMMUNE NEUROPSYCHIATRIC DISORDER ASSOCIATED WITH STREPTOCOCCAL INFECTIONS', to require health insurance coverage for the diagnosis and treatment of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorder associated with streptococcal infections.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

Proposed S.B. No. 16 SEN. CRISCO, 17th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ASSESSMENTS AND RELATED CONSULTATIONS', to require health insurance coverage for behavioral health assessments and health

care provider consultations related to such assessments.

## • House Proposed, Raised and Committee Bills Being Followed by the Department of Developmental Services

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5040</u> REP. FRANCE, 42nd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE INVENTORIES OF EXECUTIVE BRANCH STATE AGENCY FACILITIES', to require the annual inventories to identify state facilities that are being underutilized.

REF. GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION AND ELECTIONS

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5060</u> REP. BELSITO, 53rd DIST. 'AN ACT ELIMINATING THE **DEPARTMENT ON AGING'**, to eliminate overlapping state services and promote efficiency in government by undoing the prior transfer of functions from the Department of Social Services to the Department on Aging and by eliminating the Department on Aging.

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5061</u> REP. BUCK-TAYLOR, 67th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING FRAUD **DETECTION IN SOCIAL SERVICES PROGRAMS**', to expand fraud detection and prevention efforts in social services programs.

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5081</u> REP. CARPINO, 32nd DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF CHANGING THE RETIREMENT BENEFIT SYSTEM FOR NEW STATE EMPLOYEES', to study options for alternative retirement benefit systems for new state employees.

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5082</u> REP. TWEEDIE, 13th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PENALTIES FOR THE FALSIFICATION OF PUBLIC BENEFIT APPLICATIONS', to provide financial relief to the state and to discourage public benefit fraud by state employees.

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5083</u> REP. ZIOBRON, 34th DIST. 'AN ACT REPLACING THE DEFINED BENEFIT RETIREMENT PLAN FOR STATE EMPLOYEES WITH A DEFINED CONTRIBUTION RETIREMENT PLAN', to replace state employee pensions with a defined contribution retirement plan.

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5100</u> REP. CASE, 63rd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS' ACCEPTANCE OF PRIVATE INSURANCE FOR THE PROVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES TO YOUNG ADULTS', to require the acceptance of private insurance for mental health services provided to adolescents.

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5104</u> REP. ZUPKUS, 89th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF UNWANTED MEDICATION', to allow for the safe disposal

of prescription drugs.

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5175</u> REP. DAVIS, 57th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING A SUNSET FOR STATE AGENCY REGULATIONS', to require an adequate review of state agency regulations. REF. GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION AND ELECTIONS

<u>H.J. No. 3</u> REP. SAMPSON, 80th DIST. 'RESOLUTION AMENDING THE STATE CONSTITUTION TO PROHIBIT CERTAIN LOBBYING IN THE HOUSE AND SENATE CHAMBERS', to subject agency liaisons to the same rules as lobbyists regarding their presence on the House and Senate floor.
