DDS Legislative Update – March 21, 2016

This legislative update is divided into five sections:

Note: This update is not a comprehensive list of bills before the Connecticut General Assembly. DDS is tracking and assessing the bills listed below for their potential impact on DDS consumers, families and guardians, DDS employees and DDS providers.

This legislative update shows some of the bills that are being tracked by DDS this session. If a Public Hearing on a bill has been scheduled the date of the public hearing and in most instances a link to the public hearing agenda will be after the bill's description.

As the legislative session goes forward, bills will be referred from legislative committees to the House or Senate. The House or Senate then may refer the bills to other committees or chose to vote on them. In these updates, the last action taken on a bill will be in **bold.** For a bill to become law, both the House and the Senate must vote favorably on it by May 4, 2016 at midnight, and the Governor must sign the bill into law.

Key to Legislative Terminology:

Vote to Draft means a Proposed Bill will be drafted as a Committee Bill.

Reserved for Subject Matter Public Hearing means a bill will have a Public Hearing but the date of the Public Hearing is still to be determined.

Change of Reference means that the original committee is moving the bill to another committee without a Joint Favorable action.

JF means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate.

JF Change of Reference means the committee reported the bill favorably to another committee.

JFS means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate but with substitute language.

JFS Change of Reference means the committee reported the bill favorably to another committee but with substitute language.

A File Number (**File No.**) is a unique number given to a bill once it has reached the House or Senate Floor. A file copy of a bill with the file number has a plain-language description of what the bill's provisions do, written by the Office of Legislative Research and a fiscal note that explains what a bill would cost or save to implement, written by the Office of Fiscal Analysis.

A House or Senate Calendar Number (**House or Senate Cal. No.**) is also a unique number that is given to a bill once it reaches the House or Senate Floor. This number is used to hold the bill's place on either the House or Senate Calendar. If the bill is a House bill (H.B. 5000 or higher) or a Senate bill (S.B.1 to

4999) it first gets a Calendar Number from the chamber the bill originated in. Once a House bill is passed in the House, it goes on to the Senate where it receives a Senate Calendar Number. Likewise once a Senate bill (with a Senate Calendar Number) passes the Senate, it goes to the House and receives a House Calendar Number.

Some Information You May Want to Know as the Session Continues

At this time in a legislative session bills are being voted out of committee and are starting to make their way through either the Senate or the House, and if all goes well, to eventual passage into law. This is the time also where bills die for any number of reasons but, most often, because a bill may cost something and there is no money in the state's budget for it.

Once bills are voted out of a committee either with a **Joint Favorable (JF)** report or a **Joint Favorable Substitute (JFS)** report, they are either sent to the Senate or the House depending on where the bill originated. The Senate or the House then creates a **File Copy** of the bill that has the bill's language including substitute language added or changes made by the committee when reporting out the bill. A **File Copy** includes a **Fiscal Note** prepared by the **Office of Fiscal Analysis (OFA)** that estimates what the bill might cost and who would bear the cost of the bill's provisions were the bill to be enacted. Also included in the **File Copy** is a **Bill Analysis** prepared by the **Office of Legislative Research (OLR)** which explains the sections of the bill in plain language and gives background on current law affecting the subject matter of the bill.

Each <u>File Copy</u> is assigned a unique number (example: <u>File No. 25</u>) and the link to the bill's **File Copy** will be listed after the title of the bill in the DDS Updates. **The exception to a bill only having one File Copy and one File Copy Number is when a bill is amended by the House and sent to the Senate. In these cases, the amended bill receives a new File Copy** that includes any amended language from the House and a **second, unique File Copy Number**. If the Senate amends a bill and sends it to the House the File Copy and the File Copy Number remain the same because the House adopts any Senate amendments separately.

After the bill has a **File Copy**, the bill is assigned a **Calendar Number** by either the **Senate** or the **House** depending on which legislative chamber the bill is in. This also is a unique number (example: **Senate Cal. No. 77**) that determines where the bill is placed on the **Senate Calendar** or **House Calendar**. The bill's **Calendar Number** is important to know on days when the Senate and House are conducting business because the bills that are available to be taken up are listed by Calendar Number on the **House's GO List** for that day or are **marked GO on the Senate Calendar** during the Senate session. Once a bill is passed through either the Senate or the House, the bill moves to the other chamber where it is given another unique Calendar Number for that chamber's Calendar.
