DDS Legislative Update – May 6, 2016

This legislative update is divided into ten sections:

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The 2016 legislative session ended at midnight on Wednesday, May 4, 2016. Although a budget adjustment bill for the fiscal year 2017 was not passed (see below for details) a great deal of legislation received final action on the last night of session. All legislation passed in both the Senate and the House becomes either a **Public Act (PA)** or a **Special Act (SA)** and then must be signed by the Governor for it to become law. If the Governor vetoes a bill both the Senate and the House may override the Governor's veto by a two-thirds majority of its members and then the bill would become law.

Budget Update: Governor Malloy and the House and Senate Democrats reached an agreement on the budget adjustments for fiscal year 2017 on the last day of the 2016 session. The legislative leadership decided that there was not enough time for the House and Senate members to read and understand the various provisions of the budget adjustment bill and the bills needed to implement the proposed budget adjustments, so the leadership determined that these bills would be taken up in a special session. Both the Senate and the House passed <u>Senate Joint Resolution No. 46</u> RESOLUTION CONVENING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN SPECIAL SESSION that calls the legislature into special session for purposes of taking up the budget adjustments including budget adjustment implementer bills, state bond authorizations, school construction bonding, and the conveyance bill. The Senate and House are expected to convene the May Special Session sometime during the week of May 9, 2016.

Because no budget adjustments were passed during the regular session, the FY16/FY17 budget passed last year (Public Act No. 15-244 AN ACT CONCERNING THE STATE BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 2017, AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS THEREFOR, AND OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED TO REVENUE, DEFICIENCY APPROPRIATIONS AND TAX FAIRNESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT) remains in effect but with an anticipated shortfall of more than \$900 million still to be resolved. **Note:** This update is not a comprehensive list of bills before the Connecticut General Assembly. DDS is tracking and assessing the bills listed below for their potential impact on DDS consumers, families and guardians, DDS employees and DDS providers. As of May 4th any bill that was not voted out of committee has been removed from the bill tracking lists.

This legislative update shows some of the bills that are being tracked by DDS this session. If a Public Hearing on a bill has been scheduled the date of the public hearing and in most instances a link to the public hearing agenda will be after the bill's description.

As the legislative session goes forward, bills will be referred from legislative committees to the House or Senate. The House or Senate then may refer the bills to other committees or chose to vote on them. In these updates, the last action taken on a bill will be in **bold.** For a bill to become law, both the House and the Senate must vote favorably on it by May 4, 2016 at midnight, and the Governor must sign the bill into law.

Key to Legislative Terminology:

Vote to Draft means a Proposed Bill will be drafted as a Committee Bill.

Reserved for Subject Matter Public Hearing means a bill will have a Public Hearing but the date of the Public Hearing is still to be determined.

Change of Reference means that the original committee is moving the bill to another committee without a Joint Favorable action.

JF means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate.

JF Change of Reference means the committee reported the bill favorably to another committee. **JFS** means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate but with substitute language.

JFS Change of Reference means the committee reported the bill favorably to another committee but with substitute language.

A File Number (**File No.**) is a unique number given to a bill once it has reached the House or Senate Floor. A file copy of a bill with the file number has a plain-language description of what the bill's provisions do, written by the Office of Legislative Research and a fiscal note that explains what a bill would cost or save to implement, written by the Office of Fiscal Analysis.

A House or Senate Calendar Number (**House or Senate Cal. No.**) is also a unique number that is given to a bill once it reaches the House or Senate Floor. This number is used to hold the bill's place on either the House or Senate Calendar. If the bill is a House bill (H.B. 5000 or higher) or a Senate bill (S.B.1 to 4999) it first gets a Calendar Number from the chamber the bill originated in. Once a House bill is passed in the House, it goes on to the Senate where it receives a Senate Calendar Number. Likewise once a Senate bill (with a Senate Calendar Number) passes the Senate, it goes to the House and receives a House Calendar Number. • Bills Proposed by the Department of Developmental Services

Additionally, the bill, as amended, requires the DDS commissioner, at least annually, to provide to individuals who receive annual DDS funding or services or their guardians or representatives, information about (1) the regional advisory council's statutory responsibilities and (2) how to access information about the council's meetings.

The bill also expands the types of entities that the probate court may appoint as guardians for adults with intellectual disabilities to include, in addition to private, nonprofit corporations authorized under current law, (1) for-profit corporations, (2) limited liability companies, (3) partnerships, and (4) other state-recognized nonprofit or for-profit entities. Under the bill, this change applies to both (1) plenary guardians, who supervise all aspects of an adult's care, and (2) limited guardians, who supervise certain specified aspects of an adult's care. The bill makes several changes to the confidentiality of documents in guardianship cases. Additionally, the bill renames the term "ward" to "protected person," which still refers to a person for whom the probate court grants guardianship.

No. 551 The bill, as amended, broadens the circumstances when the Department of Social Services (DSS) must disclose the results of an investigation into suspected elderly abuse, neglect, exploitation, or abandonment, but limits the type of information that may be disclosed. Under current law, if the elderly individual is a long-term care facility resident, the commissioner must, upon request, disclose the investigation's results to the person who initially reported the suspected abuse. The bill (1) requires the commissioner to disclose an investigation's results to the person who made the report, regardless of whether the elderly individual resides in a long-term care facility, and (2) restricts what information may be disclosed. The bill also requires the DSS commissioner to develop a plan to (1) incorporate the federal Administration for Community Living's Voluntary Consensus Guidelines for State Adult Protective Services into the state's elderly protective services program and (2) align state elder abuse data collection with the National Adult Maltreatment Reporting System standards. It also (1) extends, from 30 to 45 days, the time the DSS has after completing an investigation to disclose the findings to the person who reported the suspected abuse and (2) restricts the disclosure to mandated reporters.

The bill, as amended, makes the following changes in statutes concerning the Department of Rehabilitation Services' (DORS) programs: 1. eliminates DORS workshops for blind people (DORS has not operated the workshops since 2003); 2. eliminates eligibility for state employee health insurance coverage for blind individuals formerly employed in DORS workshops; 3. eliminates labeling and registering requirements for certain goods made by blind people; and 4. eliminates a requirement that entities supported in whole or part by the state that purchase products or services provided by persons with disabilities (excluding blindness) do so through DORS.

It (1) transfers, from the Regulation Review Committee to state agencies' legislative committees of cognizance, responsibility for conducting periodic reviews of agencies' existing regulations; (2) makes minor changes to certain deadlines and effective periods associated with emergency regulations; (3) expands the reasons for which agencies may propose amendments to regulations without prior notice or public comment; and (4) modifies provisions concerning the agency's (a) posting of notices of proposed regulations on the eRegulations System, (b) delivery of the notices to certain interested parties, and (c) responses to public comments. **REF. GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION AND ELECTIONS Public Hearing March 7, 2016** Government Administration and Elections Committee JFS to the House. House passed as amended by House Amendment A. Senate passed as amended by House Amendment A.

H.B. No. 5537 (RAISED) PUBLIC HEALTH. 'AN ACT CONCERNING VARIOUS REVISIONS TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH STATUTES' <u>House File No. 535</u>, House Cal. No. 337, <u>Senate File No.</u>

766, **Senate Cal. No. 567** This bill, as amended, makes numerous substantive, minor, and technical changes to Department of Public Health (DPH)-related statutes and programs. The bill: 1. makes changes affecting local health departments, such as establishing a process to address alleged impropriety by local health directors or their employees; 2. creates a new designation of dental assistant and requires dental professionals to take continuing education in infection control; 3. allows nursing home patients to receive methadone treatment for opioid addiction at the nursing home; 4. recognizes in statute a category of psychology technicians and allows them to provide services related to psychological testing; 5. as of July 1, 2017, eliminates the Office of Protection and Advocacy for Persons with Disabilities and requires the governor to designate a nonprofit entity to serve this function; 6. creates a diabetes advisory council in DPH, within available appropriations; and 7. creates a nail salon working group and a medical records task force.

No. 225, <u>Senate File No. 764</u>, Senate Cal. No. 543 The bill, as amended, establishes, within the Council on

Medical Assistance Program Oversight (MAPOC), a standing subcommittee to study, make recommendations, and report to the governor, MAPOC, and the Children's, Human Services, and Public Health committees on the efficacy of support systems for children and young adults age 21 or younger with developmental disabilities, with or without co-occurring mental health conditions. For purposes of completing the two required reports, the bill requires the following individuals to be on the subcommittee: 1. the child and healthcare advocates, or their designees; 2. a family or child advocate; 3. the executive directors of the Council on Developmental Disabilities and the Connecticut Association of Public School Superintendents, or their designees; and 4. an expert in diagnosing, evaluating, educating, and treating children and young adults with developmental disabilities.

For the bill's purposes, "developmental disability" means an individual's severe, chronic disability as defined by federal law.

No. 444, to (1) redact the month and day of an individual's date of birth when a list prepared under title 9 of the general statutes is disclosed pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act and prohibit publication of any such list on the Internet web site by the person having requested such list pursuant to said act, (2) require that certain meeting notices are electronically filed with the Secretary of the State

and posted on an Internet web site designated by said Secretary, and (3) allow for notice of special and reconvened sessions to be sent electronically.

GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION AND ELECTIONS** <u>Public Hearing March 14, 2016</u> Government Administration and Elections Committee JFS to the House. <u>H.B. No. 5619</u> died in the House.

• Midterm Budget Adjustments Fiscal Year 2017

Both the Republican House and Senate Caucus and the Democrat House and Senate Caucus have put forward budget adjustment proposals for fiscal year 2017 since the Appropriations Committee voted on **H.B. No. 5044 AN ACT MAKING ADJUSTMENTS TO STATE EXPENDITURES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2017**. Governor Malloy has indicated that he will release a third version of midterm budget adjustments taking into consideration some items that have been in the caucuses' budget adjustment proposals. The **Consensus Revenue Estimates** that were signed off on by the Office of Policy and Management and the Office of Fiscal Analysis were put forward on April 29, 2016. These are the revenue estimates that inform how much money is available to fund the spending portion of any budget bill.

• Governor's Revised Midterm Budget Adjustments Fiscal Year 2017

On Tuesday, April 12, 2016, Governor Malloy released the <u>GOVERNOR'S REVISED MIDTERM</u> <u>BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS FISCAL YEAR 2017</u> in response to the budget adjustments proposed by the Appropriations Committee in <u>H.B. No. 5044</u> AN ACT MAKING ADJUSTMENTS TO STATE EXPENDITURES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2017. The Governor's revised budget adjustments would close the state's projected \$922 million deficit for fiscal year 2017. DDS's agency operations funding total for FY17 remained at \$ 610,004,298 in the Governor's Revised Midterm Budget Adjustments, which was the same total as in the Governor's original <u>GOVERNOR'S</u> <u>MIDTERM BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS FISCAL YEAR 2017</u> put forward in February.

The legislative leadership and the Governor must now work on drafting Budget Adjustment legislation that will pass the House and Senate and be signed by the Governor.

• FY17 Appropriations Committee Budget Adjustments

On Wednesday, April 6, 2016, the Appropriations Committee voted on its budget adjustment bill, <u>H.B.</u> <u>No. 5044</u> AN ACT MAKING ADJUSTMENTS TO STATE EXPENDITURES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2017. The bill passed with a vote of 33 yea and 24 nay along party lines. The Office of Fiscal Analysis' <u>APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE BUDGET FY 17</u> **MIDTERM ADJUSTMENTS** details the various changes to each state agency's budget for fiscal year 2017 that begins on July 1, 2016. **On pages 168 through 173, the Department of Developmental Services' budget adjustments for FY17 are shown.**

The Finance, Revenue and Bonding Committee on Thursday, April 7, 2016 voted 30 to 21 to pass <u>H.B.</u> <u>No. 5046</u> ACT CONCERNING REVENUE ITEMS TO IMPLEMENT THE GOVERNOR'S BUDGET The Office of Fiscal Analysis' <u>Preliminary Fiscal Notes for Finance Committee Meeting</u> <u>on April 7, 2016</u> explains the adjustments to the state's revenue stream for FY17 to support the budget adjustments previously passed by the Appropriations Committee.

Both <u>H.B. No. 5044</u> and <u>H.B. No. 5046</u> would need to be passed by both the House and the Senate and be signed by the Governor for these bills' budget adjustments to take effect. The FY17 budget adjustments are needed to cover an estimated \$900 million shortfall in the state's budget for FY17 that begins July 1, 2016 and ends June 30, 2017. Governor Malloy has indicated that he will put forward a revised FY17 Midterm Budget Adjustments bill that would provide additional budget adjustments to cover the growing projected budget deficit for FY17.

• FY16 Legislative Deficit Mitigation

On Tuesday, March 29, 2016, the Senate and House passed Emergency Certified <u>S.B. No. 474</u> AN ACT MAKING ADJUSTMENTS TO THE STATE BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 2017 as amended by <u>Senate Amendment A</u>. Senate Amendment A was a "strike-all" amendment that replaced the original language in the bill with the agreed upon deficit mitigation plan. The Senate passed the amended bill on a vote of 33 to 3. The House of Representatives passed the bill 127 to 16. The provisions of the bill will go into effect once the Governor has signed it. The deficit mitigation package in <u>S.B. No. 474</u> replaces Governor Malloy's list of <u>rescissions announced on March 16, 2016</u>.

S.B. No. 474, as amended by Senate Amendment A, reduces the current fiscal year's (FY16) expenditures by a total of \$220 million. DDS's portion of these deficit mitigation reductions is just under \$3.4 million. The 2016 fiscal year ends June 30, 2016 and the bill's reductions are being made to the final quarter (April, May and June) of the department's budget.

Members of the General Assembly also voted to extend the JF deadlines (the day a committee must report out its bills) by one week for the Appropriations Committee until April 7th and the Finance, Revenue and Bonding Committee until April 8th so as to allow these committees to complete work on the fiscal year 2017 (FY17) budget adjustment legislation.

• Governor's Midterm Budget Adjustments Fiscal Year 2017

On the 2016 session's opening day, February 3, 2016, Governor Malloy addressed the General Assembly and detailed his midterm budget adjustments for fiscal year 2017.
