# DDS Legislative Update – February 9, 2018

# This legislative update is divided into five sections:

- Bills Proposed by DDS
- Senate Proposed, Raised and Committee Bills Being Followed by DDS

**Note:** This update is <u>not</u> a comprehensive list of bills before the Connecticut General Assembly. DDS is tracking and assessing the bills listed below for their potential impact on DDS consumers, families and guardians, DDS employees and DDS providers.

This legislative update shows some of the bills that are being tracked by DDS this session. If a Public Hearing on a bill has been scheduled, the date of the public hearing and in most instances a link to the public hearing agenda will be after the bill's description.

As the legislative session goes forward, bills will be referred from legislative committees to the House or Senate. The House or Senate then may refer the bills to other committees or chose to vote on them. In these updates, the last action taken on a bill will be in **bold.** For a bill to become law, both the House and the Senate must vote favorably on it by May 9, 2018 at midnight, and the Governor must sign the bill into law.

## **Key to Legislative Terminology:**

Vote to Draft means a Proposed Bill will be drafted as a Committee Bill.

**Reserved for Subject Matter Public Hearing** means a bill will have a Public Hearing but the date of the Public Hearing is still to be determined.

**Change of Reference** means that the original committee is moving the bill to another committee without a Joint Favorable action.

**JF** means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate.

**JF Change of Reference** means the committee reported the bill favorably to another committee.

**JFS** means the committee reported the bill favorably to the House or Senate but with substitute language.

**JFS Change of Reference** means the committee reported the bill favorably to another committee but with substitute language.

A File Number (**File No.**) is a unique number given to a bill once it has reached the House or Senate Floor. A file copy of a bill with the file number has a plain-language description of what the bill's provisions do, written by the Office of Legislative Research and a fiscal note, which explains what a bill would cost or save if implemented, written by the Office of Fiscal Analysis.

A House or Senate Calendar Number (**House Cal. No. or Senate Cal. No.**) is also a unique number that is given to a bill once it reaches the House or Senate Floor. This number is used to hold the bill's place on either the House or Senate Calendar. If the bill is a House bill (H.B. 5000 or higher) or a Senate bill (S.B.1 to 4999) it first gets a Calendar Number from the chamber the bill originated in. Once a House bill is passed in the House, it goes on to the Senate where it receives a Senate Calendar Number.

Likewise once a Senate bill (with a Senate Calendar Number) passes the Senate, it goes to the House and receives a House Calendar Number.

# • Bills Proposed by the Department of Developmental Services

The **Public Health Committee** at their **February 9, 2018** committee meeting voted to raise as bills the Department of Developmental Services 2018 legislative proposals. These five legislative proposals will now be drafted as bills and each will have a Public Health Committee public hearing sometime towards the end of February or in early March. The five bills that make up DDS's 2018 legislative package are:

- 1. AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES' RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING OVERSIGHT OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE AND END-OF-LIFE PLANNING
- 2. AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES' RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING GUARDIANSHIP ASSESSMENTS
- 3. AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES' RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING WAIVER OF FEE AND NOTARY REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIVATE PROVIDERS LICENSING APPLICATIONS
- 4. AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES' RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING DDS GROUP HOME LICENSING VISITS
- 5. AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES' RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING TECHNICAL CHANGES TO THE DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES STATUTES

The APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE will hold state agency budget presentations and a public hearing on FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 2018 in ROOM 2C of the Legislative Office Building (LOB). The budget presentations for state health agencies are scheduled on February 16<sup>th</sup> as follows:

11:00 A.M. - 12:00 P.M. Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services

1:00 P.M. - 1:30 P.M. Department of Public Health

1:30 P.M. - 2:00 P.M. Office of the Chief Medical Examiner

The Appropriations Committee Public Hearing on February 16<sup>th</sup> will begin at 4:00 p.m. in Room 2C of the LOB.

Below are the **rules for testifying** before the Appropriations Committee. **Please note** that for both the Health Agencies public hearing and the Human Services Agencies public hearing, **the Appropriations Committee makes accommodations for persons with special needs and their families.** 

Public speaker order for the public hearings will be determined by a lottery system. Lottery numbers will be drawn from 9:00 A.M. until 10:00 A.M. in the LOB First Floor Atrium and from 10:15 A.M. until 1:00 P.M. in Room 2700. Speakers arriving after the completion of the lottery will have their names placed at the end of the speaker list. The list of speakers registered through the lottery system will be posted outside the designated hearing room two hours prior to the start of the public hearing.

On February 16th and February 21st the Committee will provide a separate sign-up sheet for persons with special needs, and on February 22nd a separate sign-up sheet will be provided for elementary and secondary education students. Those speakers will be registered on a first-come, first-served basis. The Committee Chairs will alternate between the specialized lists and the standard list until the specialized lists have been exhausted. For the February 16th public hearing, Room 2600 will be reserved for individuals with special needs in need of a quiet space while waiting to testify.

Speakers will be limited to three minutes of testimony. Please submit 30 copies of written testimony at the time of sign-up, but not later than 2:00 P.M. Testimony received after the designated time may not be distributed until after the hearing. Please email written testimony in Word or PDF format to <a href="mailto:APPtestimony@cga.ct.gov">APPtestimony@cga.ct.gov</a>. The Committee requests that testimony be limited to matters related to the items on the Agenda. All public hearing testimony, written & spoken, is public information. The Committee encourages witnesses to submit a written statement and to condense oral testimony to a summary of that statement. All public hearing testimony, written and spoken, is public information. As such, it will be made available on the CGA website and will be indexed by internet search engines. Unofficial sign-up sheets have no standing with the Committee.
