Information provided by the provider describing their agency:

Resources for Human Development (RHD) has extensive experience in a wide range of human services, including the development of community-based programs for individuals who have been previously institutionalized and who have multiple diagnoses. Established in 1970, RHD programs include community residences and other community-based services for people with intellectual disabilities, mental illness, and substance abuse disorders, and people who are homeless and includes contracts with federal, state, county, and city agencies to operate programs in fourteen states.

RHD is a values-driven organization. We do not merely encourage all members of the corporation to support the organizational values—instead these values guide our program decisions, and our employees try to remain mindful of them at all times. Although there are a number of values that are important to the organization, the following values are considered to be "cornerstone values":

We believe that by responding to the basic good and strength in people we have the best chance of maximizing positive individual commitment and responsibility. We find this applicable when dealing with employees, recipients of services and other individuals with whom we are in contact through our many corporate activities. In practice, this philosophy translates into encouraging, assisting, supporting, educating and allowing a person to make commitments and take responsibilities. It means trusting employees to do their jobs or believing in their potential to take on more difficult tasks. It means allowing a client of one of our programs to do things that may at times seem risky, knowing that the gains from the attempt (success or failure) will outweigh the stagnation of the status quo.

RHD/Connecticut opened its first program in 1997 and currently operates 10 DDS licensed Community Living Arrangements (CLA's). There are two CLA's and one day program in the South Region. There is one CLA and one consumer supported in a Continuous Residential Support environment in the North Region. There are seven CLA's, one day program and a Supported Living program in the West Region.
