Information provided by the provider describing their agency:

Disability Resource Network Inc. is a consumer-driven, community-based resource organization providing an array of services to adults and students with disabilities. Our primary mission is to develop and enhance the skills needed to promote an independent style of living, toward the end of becoming positive and productive community members.

DRN has two day program sites located in Derby and Bridgeport. Our day programs strive to enhance the daily lives of the individuals we serve. Our buildings have teaching kitchens and laundry rooms to enhance daily living skills lessons, classrooms for each group of consumers, and recreational areas. Our consumers go on regular recreational outings, visit their local library and YMCA once per week, and attend volunteer sites when possible. DRN operates its own fleet of vehicles which includes wheelchair accessible vans.

DRN also works with high school students with disabilities ages 14 to 21. We offer transition programming as well as attend PPT meetings and offer an alternative education program. These students are taught pre-vocational skills, independent living skills, and work on academics. DRN staff will accompany students who are starting their college careers and require a paraprofessionals support. We also run a recreation program for high school students that include visits to the movie theater, mall and events at the Harbor Yard Arena in Bridgeport.
