Information provided by the provider describing their agency:

Jewish Family Services' predecessor organization was founded in 1912. Originally established to serve destitute Jewish widows and orphans, in contemporary times the agency has evolved into a multi-service, nonsectarian agency that serves clients of all cultures and religions.

The JFS mission is to enhance and strengthen quality of life through the Jewish tradition of caring and compassion. JFS achieves its mission by helping individuals and families progress toward emotional well-being, self-reliance and more positive relationships

The goals are to provide effective preventive and therapeutic services that meet the complex needs of clients, and to promote clients' self-sufficiency. This is accomplished within the philosophical framework of a commitment to serving clients who are in need, whether their need is emotional, spiritual, functional, material or financial.

Description of current programs

- Care at Home – provides caregivers for elderly to remain in their own homes
- Older Adult Services – provides counseling and support services to people 60 and older
- Family Counseling – mental health treatment for those ages 18 to 59
- Rothstein Child Services Program – encompasses mental health services ages 3-17
- Special Needs – counseling and support services for the developmentally disabled
- Safety Net Services Program – supporting those transitioning from public assistance to the workforce
- Programs for Holocaust Survivors – support to help meet vital needs
- PEP and Focus on KIDS – programs to educate and support parents living apart
- JETS: Jewish Employment Transition Services for the unemployed
- Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry – for anyone suffering food insecurity or hunger
- Tara's Closet – Clothing for those in need and education to help abolish stigma
- EmployAbility – providing customized employment for young adults living with disabilities (opening in 2018)
