Information provided by the provider describing their agency:

The Children's Community Programs of Connecticut, founded in 1999, is a multiservice agency whose mission is to provide diverse and creative support services to children and families throughout Connecticut. Our goal is to help children, youth and families thrive in their homes and communities. CCP provides several types of foster care services:

Family Functional Therapy Foster Care, Therapeutic Foster Care, Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children, Transitional Foster Care and Long-Term Foster Care. Additionally, Pathways Academy, New Haven Extension and KEY

educational programs are located within our private special education school in East Haven serving adolescents ages 12-

21. Our Family Development Support Services provides home visiting services for young parents within three programs:

Healthy Families America, Parents as Teachers, and CT Early Years programs. Working with Connecticut CSSD referred

youth, our Educational Support Services Program provides educational advocacy for court involved youth. The Youth

Transitional Services Program includes our Workforce Alliance service which offers job training and vocational counseling for youth and young adults both in school and out of school, and our innovative TEAM Program. TEAM (Together Everyone Achieves More) is our DDS approved transitional (Non-Behavioral) Special Education program that

teaches, explores, and develops occupational and life skills for graduating high school seniors ages 18-22. Students who

apply to the TEAM program have sufficient academic credits and need training in transition services in preparation for

graduating high school, post-secondary education, and the workforce. Students receive their high school diploma upon

completion of the TEAM Program. TEAM Open Enrollment hosts a classroom size of a maximum of six students per

class. This gives each student the attention they need to develop intellectually, socially, and emotionally, discover character, and expand skill sets. In the year ending June 30, 2024, our agency provided service to 1140 clients. www.ccp.ct.org
