Information provided by the provider describing their agency:

When Social Worker Pauline Lang conceived of the idea that grew into the West Haven Community House in 1941, she envisioned a place that would respond to the varied needs of West Haven. In those days Pauline focused primarily on youth, believing strong support of and advocacy for young people would ensure an equally strong future for West Haven. Seventy years later, serving the community's youngest citizens remains a strong part of the Community House with 144 Head Start families and school aged child care and enrichment programs for over 300 children.

For over 45 years, we have advocated for and worked with the intellectually disabled to meet the special challenges they face in employment, housing and in the community. Our Community Connections residential program serves 23 adults with intellectual disabilities and other related health issues. Our Community Connections program provides services for 100+ adults with disabilities. We offer activities designed to incorporate skill development, local community integration, therapeutic benefits and health activities. We also operate a transitional academy, "The Avenues", for your intellectually disabled adults between the ages of 18 and 21.

As the largest private not for profit agency in West Haven, we pride ourselves on taking a leadership role in developing partnerships with other groups in the community to provide a readily available network of services to our citizens. Some of the groups that we collaborate with are the Center for Disability Rights, West Haven's Adult Education program, Interagency Network for Children, Family Resource Center, West Haven Board of Education, the CT Afterschool Network, Connecticut Community Non Profit Alliance, West Haven Chamber of Commerce, Teach Kids Music Foundation and many other smaller groups. We receive support from many sources: fees, memberships, a variety of nonprofit, individual, community and corporate gifts and local, state and federal grants.
