# **EDS Updates**

Stay up to date with the Employment & Day Division! This section provides news and updates on different programs and services offered/overseen by the EDS Division Team.

The Employment & Day Services (EDS) Division was created in 2018 to oversee DDS employment and day options. EDS works with individuals, families, providers, community partners, and businesses to prepare individuals for competitive employment. The division currently offers a variety of day and employment services to individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities (IDD) across Connecticut, learn more below:

## **Innovative Employment Opportunity (IEO) Grant**

The Department of Developmental Services released the application for the second Innovative Employment Opportunity (IEO) Grant! The IEO Grant was established to provide support and resources for the creation or expansion of business ventures that integrate individuals with IDD into their communities through meaningful employment. Applicants can apply for an exploratory grant or an implementation/expansion grant:

#### **Exploratory Grant**

This grant will provide funding for business ideas that need an opportunity to explore the development of a viable business plan. <u>The creation of competitive integrated employment opportunities for people IDD must be an integral component of the business concept.</u> DDS will award up to \$4,000 for this grant.

#### **Implementation/Expansion Grant**

This grant is for applicants who have a business, product or service; targeted market; and/or business goals; and are *already in development and ready to implement or expand.* The creation of competitive integrated employment opportunities for people with IDD must be an integral component of the business concept. DDS will award grants in three brackets for this type of grant: \$10,000; \$25,000; or \$50,000 (Examples of appropriate requests include, but are not limited to, funds for marketing, consultant fees, procurement of equipment and assistive technology, and development of technology systems).

### **Customized Employment VIDEO**

Customized Employment (CE) is a service that helps adults with significant disabilities achieve competitive integrated employment. CE is a highly structured, time limited process meant for individuals who have tried other services and need more support to achieve employment.



The Customized Employment process is

intensive and takes time. The CE Certified Staff Member will develop and/or negotiate an employment position that meets both the likes, strengths, and abilities of the individual job-seeker and the unmet needs of the employer. Customized Employment (CE) is carried out over three stages: Job Discovery; Job Development, Negotiation, & Placement; and Post-Employment Supports.

At the end of Customized Employment Services, individuals should be placed in a competitive employment position and can transition to either natural supports or an Individualized Supported Employment (ISE) service placement. ISE Services can consist of on the job-supports and job-coaching.

The goal of the ADS-DDS CE team is to increase capacity to provide the service to individuals across the state. The State offers a free CE Certification Course to DDS provider agency staff members. Only staff members with an active CE Certification can provide the service in Connecticut.

## **Project SEARCH**

There are **10** Project SEARCH programs across Connecticut. Project SEARCH is a nine-month internship training program, available to school transition age students and young adults eligible for DDS services, who need more intensive employment skills training. ## **Employment Services Strategic Planning Committees**

In February 2021, the State Employment Leadership Network (SELN) published their Finding & Observations Report on the State of Connecticut Department of Developmental Services Employment Services. The report commends strengths, reviews areas of improvement, and makes recommendations for action.

As a result of SELN recommendations, DDS created various stakeholder subcommittees to develop recommendations to improve outcomes for individuals with intellectual disability seeking to obtain and maintain employment. We are now starting to put these recommendations into action. Below are some of the exciting changes that went into effect on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 based on these recommendations.

#### Individual Supported Employment (ISE) Updates

- There will be one uniform rate for the ISE Employment Incentives. (\$55/hr)
- The cap on ISE hours is being removed. An individual will be able to utilize their Day funding for ISE or a combination of ISE and other Day supports up to their LON amount.
- Whenever possible, one-time ISE authorizations will utilize "Add Hours" to minimize the additional administrative burden and allow WebResDay billing in lieu of submitting "actuals".
