Individualized Home Support (IHS) is a type of residential service where a staff person provides support to you in your home or your family home and in your community according to your person-centered plan.



How is IHS typically staffed?

- You can use an agency or hire your own staff (see Self-Direction): RewardingWork.org/CT ►
- IHS is not a 24-hour support. The number of hours you qualify for is based on your level of need and funding
- IHS could include in person and/ or virtual supports based on your needs and your person-centered plan



What are some of the benefits?

- Individualized staffing support
- Supports are based on your needs and wants
- Supports can be used in your home and in the community
