#### A. Physical Plant:

- The Business Office now has a bid for the playground
- It is not official, but will probably be working with KOMPAN
- March Job Fair had low attendance

#### 6. Foundation Report:

- April reported that there is a meeting on April 23rd
- A schedule was set for monthly meetings to be held on the 4th Wednesday of each month
- Train Show is scheduled for November 8th
- Foundation received an \$80,000 grand from the Community Foundation for the Nature Trail

#### 7. DDS:

- Brian reported that DDS has released a direct support staff job board
- A contractor is currently working on concepts for May 23<sup>rd</sup> IDD Day; the event will be from 10-3pm
- Pamphlets are to be mailed to every DDS individual or passholders
- The Governor has made a proclamation for this day to be a yearly event
- Rain date is May 28th
- Compiling a list of vendors for resources and activities
- The provider network will be made aware of this event
- Also contacting the State Department of Education to get the message out
- Allison shared that all school districts have developed the site CT Reap that posts open school positions
- Stan questioned what compensation would be made for the work people are being asked to do; will it be addressed in a meaningful way
- Brian couldn't directly answer; there were no concrete details but there is a discussion ongoing
- Allison shared that last year the Department of Education started to create a model para-education program for high school seniors
- She has not seen any results of the plan
- Jackson shared that there has been the development of a standardized training program to create a pool of competent staff

- Stan encouraged everyone to contact legislators regarding the next steps in budget changes
- He suggested contacting them on a regular basis
