## DEPUTY DESPP COMMISSIONER BRENDA BERGERON RETIRING FROM THE DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND HOMELAND SECURITY AFTER 37 YEARS OF STATE SERVICE

MIDDLETOWN – Brenda Bergeron, who has led DESPP's Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security (DEMHS) with a steady hand during some of the state's most demanding emergencies, has announced her plans to retire in early 2026. Bergeron has been a public servant for the State of Connecticut for 37 years.
