FUTURE OFFICERS TO GRADUATE FROM CONNECTICUT POLICE ACADEMY ON WEDNESDAY

The Connecticut Police Academy will graduate 26 recruits on Wednesday at the 386TH Training Session Graduation at Central Connecticut State University.

The future police officers will go to work in police departments in the following municipalities: Branford, Danbury, Manchester, Newtown, Norwich, Plainville, Ridgefield, Southbury, Stratford, Torrington, Trumbull, Waterford, West Haven, Wilton, and Windsor, as well as Southern Connecticut State University Police and the UConn Police Department.

The recruits have spent the last 28 weeks preparing to become police officers in departments across Connecticut. The Connecticut Police Academy provides some of the most extensive law enforcement education in the country.

The program will include remarks from Windsor Police Chief Donald Melanson. Tyrone Mack, a recruit who will serve in the Waterford Police Department, will deliver the class speech. Arthur Fontaine, who will go to work for the UConn Police Department, will sing the National Anthem.
